HARROW Borough will face Marlow in the third qualifying round of the FA Cup after beating Well-ing United 2-0 away at the week-

Goals from Lewis Cole and James Ewington either side of the half time break were enough to see the visitors progress in the tournament, where Monday's draw handed them a home tie.

Harrow first hit their opponents close to half-time.

Two minutes into first half stoppage-time, James Taylor took a throw-in on the left, Frank Keita worked the ball into the area and Cole, in the inside-left chan-nel, took the ball past an opponent and drove it low into the net

from a very narrow angle.

The second came in the 72nd minute, after great work in midfield by Keita, Leo Donnellan and Cole led to Keita feeding Ewington. From an angle on the right of the box he controlled the ball with one touch before firing a low right-foot shot across Tom Smith into the far corner for his eighth goal in his last seven games.

Harrow finished strongly, with Otudeko shooting wide and Don-

nellan curling a free-kick over. At the final whistle, there were long celebrations by the players and a decent number of travelling fans, who'd got to North Kent despite the Chiltern Line being out of action at the weekend.

Harrow now switch their attentions back to the league and a double-header of home fixtures, against Dorchester Town next Saturday and against runaway leaders Hayes & Yeading United on Tuesday, September 28.
