## Borough lose to Casuals

HARROW'S POOR WINTER RUN CONTINUES AT WALTON

HARROW Borough started 2022 with a 2-1 defeat at the hands of Walton Casuals.

Borough began badly, with Shaun Preddie nearly heading past his own keeper in the opening minutes, while John Gilbert forced Lovre Drazic into a save, before the hosts took the lead in the 10th minute.

It was a shocking goal from a Harrow point of view, with Preddie's back-pass underhit, Drazic raced off his line, but was closed down fast by Adam Liddle, who blocked the keeper's attempted clearance, sending the ball straight into the net.

Borough rode their luck, but saw the half out without conceding a second.

They rejigged at half-time, with Marc Charles-Smith replacing Anthony O'Connor, and looked a much better side.

Charles-Smith and George Moore won successive headers to send James Ewington in on goal, but he was stopped by a fine one-handed save from Jacob Adams. The improvement in standards result-

The improvement in standards resulted in Borough finding an equaliser in the 66th minute.

Kunle Otudeko's superb pass gave Michael Bryan the opportunity to send Ewington in on goal, and this time he calmly finished past Adams for his 15th league goal of the season.

The game now was end-to-end and Preddie had to make a brave full-length dive to head clear a dangerous cross, while good work from a busy Moore led to Samuel Adenola having a fierce drive blocked.

However, Harrow's hard work was scrubbed out in the 84th minute, when Liddle drew a challenge from behind in the penalty area from Leo Donnellan. It was a cheap penalty but not one that could be argued about, and Gilbert sent Drazic the wrong way from the spot.

Harrow tried to level again through Moore, but the game had gone.
