Stones recover from loss to earn big point

WEALDSTONE were able to hold on to earn a point in their 0-0 draw with Notts County after a 2-0 defeat to Woking at the weekend.

Substitute Jamar Loza fired home in the 76th minute to seal the victory for the Cards before Stones were reduced to ten men in the closing stages.

The home side made a strong start and grabbed the lead with 19 minutes on the clock when Inih Effiong struck home the loose ball following a corner.

Wealdstone had a number of chances, the best of which arguably fell to Josh Umerah, who dragged his effort wide in the 53rd minute.

the 74th minute and his decision paid instant dividends as the pair combined for the second goal.

Things got worse for Wealdstone seven minutes from time when Douglas James-Taylor was sent off for a reckless challenge on Kyran Lofthouse.

However, there was a big improvement from Wealdstone on Tuesday evening and their point saw the promotion-chasing Magpies drop out of the National League play-off places into eighth, while the Stones edged themselves further away from the relegation

zone, moving up to 19th.

Jamie Mascoll had a good chance for Wealdstone 20 minutes in after a shot from outside the box, but Sam Slocombe was able to dive down and save.

Notts County came close two minutes into the second half with Jayden Richardson firing wide before Cal Roberts' volley was blocked and cleared by the home defence.

Richard Brindley fired a shot from 30 yards out but was denied by Stones goalkeeper George Wickens, who was able to tip the ball over the bar.

Richardson had a chance – but the Wealdstone defence were able to clear – before Kyle Wootton was denied in stoppage time, with Connor McAvoy able to block.

After the match Stones boss Stuart Maynard said his team had been "outstanding".

"In the first half we created enough half-chances to deserve a goal, but they are a top team and they've got top players and they get good blocks in and the goalie made good saves, but it's credit to our lads," he told the club YouTube channel.

"Tonight it was outstanding from the lads to come and be able to put their bodies on the line like that. We've had a four week break and we've just come and played against, for me, these and Stockport are the best two teams in the league that we've played."
