Finishing in fine style

In truth, it can fairly be said that we are finishing the campaign in fine style, and have had quite a lot to enthuse over in these last couple of months. Certainly far more than we had anticipated early in the year, when we suffered a long run without a win. Morale has never been better, and this has permeated through to our grand supporters who can really sense the wind of change, and whose thoughts are already turned to mid-August and to the start of what we are all convinced will see Wealdstone a force to be reckoned with.

Although the result at Barry on Thursday will be found elsewhere in this programme, these notes are written before, and I feel we shall do well to come back with a point. Barry, the draw specialists, played better here against us than their league position would indicate. Following on our morale-boosting win at Burton Albion, we edged home 2-1 against Athenian League leaders Croydon Amateurs on Tuesday, thanks to a very well taken 88th minute goal by young Roger Livingstone, yet another newcomer forcing his way into the reckoning from the Reserves. Undoubtedly, one of the highlights of the season has been the talent produced by Les Boyle and Edgar Francis, who have done a great job.

Manager Sid Prosser intends using that great clubman Viv Evans in a scouting capacity next season and intends to maintain the fine flow of young talent coming through. Training for next season will commence on July 4th, earlier than last season, for Mr. Prosser places great stress on 100 per cent fitness and thus wants a full six weeks preparation. Although it is common knowledge, for the record, professionals retained for next season are: John Barr, Dave Cockell, John Pearce, John Furie, Micky Brown, Terry Dyson, Ray Whitaker, Dixie Hale. Released are: Gary Townsend, Trevor Watson, Terry Dempsey, Billy Bailey and Eddie Presland. We heartily thank these five for their efforts this season, and the Club wishes them well in the future.

Now for a news item that you **won't** know about! I am sure all concerned will be delighted to know that John Barr has been voted Player of the Year by the Supporters Club, and before the kick-off today will receive the Jock Law Trophy from Mrs. Law. John, ('Gentleman John' as he was christened by me a long time ago!) has not missed a Southern League match all season; has saved us on many occasions, and apart from being a brilliant goalkeeper, is a really nice guy. His team-mates will be the first to applaud him today. An honour well-deserved, John!

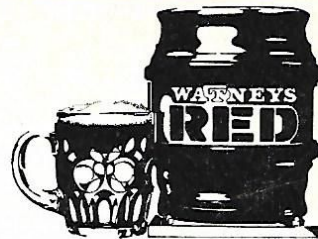
