OUR VISITORS

Northern Nomads F.C. was founded in 1900, and has provided over 30 internationals and numerous players for Middlesex Wanderers and County teams.

The main problems of the club are the absence of a good amateur league in the North-west, and also the fact that the club does not possess its own ground. Because of the latter a ground is shared with Witton Albion at North-wich (twenty miles from Manchester,

where most of the players live) and therefore home games are only possible on alternate Saturdays. However two teams are run. The 1st XI being one of the only three amateur teams in the Manchester League, and the 2nd XI, comprising mainly of schoolmasters, specialises in missionary work, playing against schools, universities and training colleges etc.

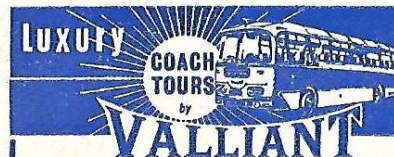
