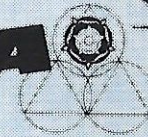

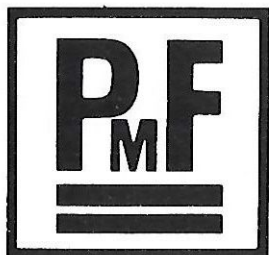

OUR third game in the Gola League brings us up against Graham Allner and his Kidderminster side. SPONSORSHIP: A DREAM FULFILLED . . . by COLIN POPE

ON behalf of chairman David Morrill and his Board of Directors, and everyone connected with Wealdstone Football Club, we are delighted to greet you, our Supporters, to the start of yet another season in which we look forward to going forward together to great things . . .

A lot has happened during the close season, the most important of which, of course, is the fact that the Alliance Premier League is no more, and we hail the opening day in the newly-formed GOLA LEAGUE and everyone involved at our level of football must be absolutely thrilled that sponsorship has arrived in such a massive way for our League.

To GOLA SPORTS LTD goes our thanks for sponsoring the League which henceforth bears its name. Gola's sponsorship, worth more than £250,000 over a three year period, is intended to benefit not only the clubs themselves, but the whole grass roots of football. We are particularly keen that it will encourage and foster participation among youngsters.

And now, a little information about the League's benefactors:

Gola, the largest British sportswear brand, was purchased in 1983 by William Lamb & Co. (Footwear) Ltd. who previously manufactured and supplied much of Gola's product range.

Lamb's themselves are the largest manufacturer of sports footwear in the UK and plan to make Gola one of the UK brand leaders again.

Product development and aggressive marketing has seen Gola sales increase from 400,000 units per year to a projected 1 million units this year, and the new management forecasts further significant sales increases over the subsequent two years.

Sponsorship of the Gola League will be the major plank in the company's 1984-5 marketing and promotional strategy.

Gola will make a financial commitment in the 1984/5 season as follows:-

- a) A payment to the League of £22,000 for distribution to member clubs on the first day of the 1984/5 season.
- b) Prize money to be awarded to the first three teams in the Gola league (£3,000, £2,000, £1,000)
- c) A monthly Gola Goal promotion to encourage more positive football, a greater number of goals and wider awareness of the Gola League. Total prize money available for the 1984/5 season is £20,000. The Gola Goal competition will run in the months of September 1984 to April 1985. A monthly jackpot of £2,500 will be available to be distributed between all clubs scoring 4 goals at home or 3 goals away in League games in the calendar month. Any club achieving 4 or 3 more than once in the month wins the appropriate number of shares in the jackpot. Prize money not won in any month will be carried over and added to the next month.
- d) Gola goal awards of £125 to the club with the highest scoring team and £125 to the club with the highest scoring player in League games during the following periods August 18th - October 31st, November 1st - December 31st, January 1st - February 28th, March 1st - May 4th.
- e) A budget will be set aside to allow the use of Gola merchandise as prizes by supporters clubs. This will be specially useful in events aimed at schools, scout associations and junior clubs. Advice and assistance in the setting up of such events will be available if required. These events could take place pre-match, ½ time or even in the close-season.

Gola have shifted their marketing effort from advertising into PR to ensure the widest possible promotion of the League and Gola name.

During the season, in conjunction with their PR advisers, J.G. Publicity Ltd. of Sheffield, Gola will assist with the setting up of seminars for commercial managers and Supporters Club secretaries, and the establishment of local sponsors for clubs.

In the second season, there will be a natural increase in cash available as Gola's promotional budget grows. The successful activity from 1984/5 will be continued.

Gola are committed to 'positive football' and additional areas of support for club success will be explored.

"The Pebbles Club" (Small Stones) (Wealdstone Football Clubs Junior Members School Scheme)

THIS year we are starting a "Pebbles Club" and as the name suggests, "A Small Stone" we are going to adopt this name for our Schools Scheme.

What is the School Scheme all about? Firstly we are inviting schools in the area to take part in a complimentary ticket scheme that will enable about 50 children from selected schools free admission into all "Gola" league games for this coming season.

Each selected school will provide a list of 50 pupils. This list will be registered at the Club.

Each child will be issued with a pass for the season for "Gola League" games, together with a lapel badge.

On attendance at the game each child will receive a draw voucher that will be handed back to the Club at the end of the season. This draw voucher will enable the child to participate in a grand draw at the end of the season. Prizes will range from BMX Bicycles to T.V. games and various other prizes.

On production of their pass, the child may be allowed to pay for an adult and for every adult paid for, the child will be issued with a further draw voucher free.

If the child misbehaves his/her membership will be withdrawn and the appropriate school informed.

Complimentary passes can only be used for Gola League Games Only but a draw ticket will be issued free on all cup games.

We regret, however, that there is no admittance to a grandstand seat unless accompanied by an Adult.

From time to time organised trips to special games for Pebbles Members only will be operating subject to demand.

No admittance to games without the Badge and the Pass. Passes are non-transferable.

Introducing Kidderminster

TIM GARNER: Goalkeeper signed from A.P. Leamington mid-way through last season, and formerly with Nuneaton Borough.

JOHN BARTON: Close season signing and appointed assistant manager. Started with Stourbridge in the Southern League, and then to Worcester City. Moved to Everton for a record £30,00 and subsequently transferred to Derby County.

JOHN MARTIN: Experienced defender who joined Kidderminster from Telford in March this year.

ANDY McGOWAN: Joined Kidderminster from Corby Town in December 1983. Formerly in Northampton Town's football league side.

CHRIS JONES: This 6ft 4inch defender signed for Kidderminster from Stourbridge in 1983. Had been "Player of the Year" for Stourbridge in three successive seasons - and was also so named in his first season with Kidderminster.

JOHN HORNE: Defender now in his third season after signing from Walsall where he made twelve first team appearances. Started as an apprentice with Aston Villa.

JOHN POWELL: Signed from Corby Town in 1979 for £1,000. Has been one of the leading scorers in Southern League, and was Kidderminster leading scorer in first season in the Alliance League. Has played for Southern League XI and also R.A.F. XI. Began his career with Notts Forest and was captain of the youth side. Was selected for England non-league squad last season - but had to decline - as he is Welsh!

GRAHAM MACKENZIE: Signed from A.P. Leamington in close season and appointed captain. Formerly with Cheltenham Town. Former captain of England Colleges XI and in representative football.

PAUL DAVIES: Local born striker who joined Cardiff City from his Kidderminster school. Appeared in Football League side, and then moved to Trowbridge.

MICKY TUOHY: Signed by Kidderminster from Worcester City in March 1984 - and scored on his debut against Dagenham. Played for Redditch and Southend before transferred to Worcester at a £6,000 fee. Toured Far East with Middlesex Wanderers in close season.

MALCOLM KAVANAGH: Another close season signing from A.P. Leamington and also formerly with Moor Green and Cheltenham Town.

ELWYN ROBERTS: Goal scorer signed from Corby Town and scored winning goal on his debut in F.A. cup match. Has played for Barnet and in Australian football.

I am delighted to have this opportunity at such an early stage in the new season of saying a warm 'welcome' to all our old friends of Wealdstone FC, and an equally sincere 'hello' to new friends, and I look forward to greeting as many of you as I can personally in the days ahead.

I always get a lot of pleasure – and not a little pride – of 'talking' to you, as it were, through this match programme, for we are all here with one common aim – for the furtherance and enhancement of Wealdstone Football Club.

I must say that last Tuesday evening was one of the highspots of my connection at Lower Mead, and I went home feeling uplifted, and (for once!) not particularly downhearted at losing a home point. I think everyone will agree we saw an excellent game of football; the crowd was much larger than we had hoped for (around 800) and somehow there seemed to be an air of exhilaration which was positively catching. Dartford went away highly impressed with our facilities, and altogether it was a splendid night – and how magnificent to hear such tremendous vocal support from our Supporters . . .

We're making a special effort this season to attract youngsters and families. You will have seen in the Harrow Observer yesterday of the Voucher scheme we are running in conjunction with the paper, whereby two youngsters under the age of 14 who present the voucher at the turnstiles, will be admitted free provided they are accompanied by an adult. This Voucher will be appearing in the Observer for quite some time, and I thank Ivor Harvey, the Observer Editor, for his valued assistance.

Which brings me to another point. To appeal to the family entertainment we do have to offer the right facilities, and we are doing everything we possibly can in this respect. But there is ONE thing that we, as a Board, CANNOT do – and that is to ensure that our patrons are able to enjoy the football here in a calm, reasonable manner, and without having the obscene chants which, alas, are so prevalent on so many grounds these days.

Happily, and for which we are deeply grateful to YOU, our Supporters, this seldom happens at Lower Mead. The very fact that we know how to enjoy our football here without resorting to bad language can only help us dramatically in getting the confidence and respect of a family audience. Otherwise I should sit at matches in trepidation!

I don't have to tell you that I remain as deeply committed to Wealdstone FC as I was the very first day I arrived! Quite apart from the physical things which have happened, and which everyone can see, there has been a tremendous amount done behind the scenes to bring us into a full professional mode. I can say that I am now delighted – and fully confident – that our organisation bears comparison with any Non-League club in the country, and we shall not be satisfied, or rest, until we have achieved the No. 1 spot in the Gola League, and be ready for any eventuality. Nobody has better, or bigger potential than we have here, and it is declared policy to realise that potential to the full. Second-best is not for us . . .

Around the Clubs

FORTY-ONE goals were scored when the Golec League season opened on Saturday, compared with 30 goals on the corresponding day last season.

Leading the way was Dagenham's new signing, Chris Kinnear (ex-Wednesday), who found the net in the first minute against Frickley Athletic. Bob Lee of Boston United recorded the season's first 'hat-trick' to help the Lincolnshire club to a 4-2 win at Yeovil. Champions Maidstone United started with a convincing 5-1 win at home to Runcorn, but Runners-up Nuneaton Borough had to be content with a 0-0 draw at home to Bath City. The League's two newcomers, Barrow and Dartford, both scored three goals in home matches, Barrow drawing with Weymouth and Dartford defeating Scarborough by a two-goal margin.

ALTRINCHAM: The League Appeal Board has set a transfer fee of £4,500 following the eve-of-season move by striker Colin Chesters from Northwich Victoria to Altrincham. Northwich's valuation had been £8,000. Other signings by the Moss Lane side include Elym Edwards, a central defender, from Runcorn, full-back Mick Fagan (son of the Liverpool manager) and midfielder Gary Anderson, who has returned from South Liverpool. In addition, central defender Dave Setella, who was with the club on loan from Blackpool last season, has signed for the club.

BARNET: Former Watford defender Ian Bolton has joined Barnet. Other additions to the Underhill squad are 19-year-old defender Andy Goodchild (ex-Spurs), 21-year-old striker Sean Baker (previously with Borehamwood) and ex-Enfield midfielder Steve Turner.

BOSTON Utd: The injury hoodoo has continued into the current campaign. Player manager Arthur Mann, who was to be in his first full season as manager, broke his left leg in the club's first public match of the season at home to Grantham in the Lincs Senior Cup and is now bedridden at his Arnold, (Notts) home encased in plaster from thigh to toe. Since Christmas, the Pilgrims have received five broken legs and a broken collar bone. Last season's leading goalscorer, Chris Cook, is another broken leg casualty having been hit by a motorbike on the last day of the 1983/84 season. **MAIDSTONE UTD:** Manager Bill Williams has signed utility defender David Carr from Torquay United and left-back Mark Hill from Wycombe Wanderers. Former Dagenham midfielder Jon Sille has signed for a small fee. John Moore and Kevin Maddocks have been released by the club, whilst central defender Mark Newson is currently on trial with Luton Town.

There will be no Rugby League at London Road this season, the club having moved to Southend. **NUNEATON BOROUGH:** The transfer of midfielder Paul Richardson from Borough to Derby County for a basic £15,000 fee on Friday represents a major transformation in fortune for the 21-year-old Richardson, who lives 13 miles from Derby and worked in the city as a Rolls Royce fitter until the end of last week, was on trial with County just over a year ago—but they decided not to sign him! Instead, he stayed with Eastwood Town before joining Borough right at the start of last season after being recommended to the club by Borough's Trevor Morley. Richardson's progress reflects great credit on Borough manager Graham Carr, who persevered with him early last season when many people doubted his ability.

Barry Lowe has now signed for the club following a successful trial, but Carr is not pursuing his interest in fellow triallist Ian Hendry. Striker/midfielder Mario Ippolito has joined the club from Peterborough United, for whom he appeared 32 times over the last two seasons.

RUNCORN: Runcorn manager John Williams has signed striker Mark Carter from Bangor City on a free transfer following a contractual blunder by the Welsh club. Joining Carter at Canal Street are central defender/midfielder Graham Jones, a veteran of 235 Football League appearances with Luton Town, Torquay United, etc., Steve Jones, a 19-year-old central defender/midfielder formerly with Wrexham and 19-year-old midfielder Steve Bradshaw.

WEYMOUTH: Midfielder Andy Townsend, who spent part of last season on loan to Weymouth from Welling United, signed for the Dorset side on Friday. No fee has been disclosed for the player, who was recently on trial with Sheffield Wednesday, but press reports say Weymouth paid £13,000.

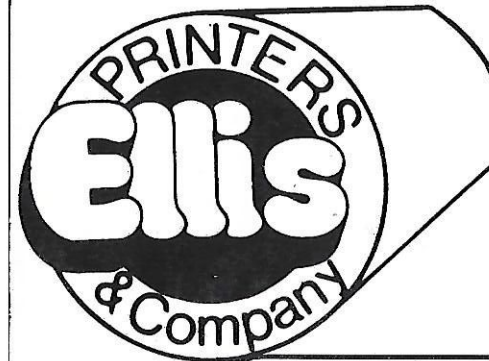
