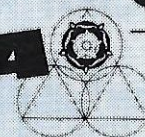

Introducing Gateshead . . .

KENNY DODDS – Born in Portsmouth, Kenny's goalkeeping career started at Chelsea when he was 15. He was later on the books of Sunderland and Aldershot, before joining Gateshead in August 1980, and until a recent injury had missed only one game. Now 24, he was the clubs 'Player of the Year' last season.

STEVE HIGGINS – Now in his fifth season with the club, 22 year old Steve was originally signed from a local youth team. A talented full-back who has won league and F.A. representative honours, he played a number of games in Newcastle U central league side at the end of last season.

DAVE PARNABY – In four seasons at the Internation Stadium, David has played in every position in the team except goalkeeper, but last season was particularly outstanding in the central defence of the team. Previously with Durham City, he is a P.E. teacher by profession and a good all round sportsman.

DAVE MITCHINSON – Born in Newcastle and played for Blyth Spartans and in New Zealand. Joined Gateshead during the season to add strength and experience to our defence. Partners Dave Parnaby.

JUSTIN ROBSON – Signed in the close season from Newcastle Utd, a 20 year old he comes to the club with credentials good enough to suggest it may not be long before he is back in the Football League. Younger brother of England skipper, Bryan, he operates very effectively in defence or midfield.

PETER DAVIES – Peter rejoined Gateshead this season after a spell abroad. He is a very experienced midfielder player, but has yet to capture the form which made him a firm favourite with the supporters a few years ago. Peter has also had spells with both Carlisle and Blyth Sp.

JIM PEARSON – Born in Scotland. Started his career with St. Johnson. Achieved an under 23 cap not long after. Had experience with Everton and Newcastle Utd before going into management with North Shields. This is his second spell at Gateshead. An out and out striker was top scorer in Northern League 83/84.

KEITH McNALL – Signed from Crook Town latter part of 83-84. A centre forward who is hungry for goals and while still only 21 years of age has attracted League Scouts from all 4 Leagues.

IAN DONALDSON – Another close season signing, Ian comes to the club with a first-class record as a goal getter with Ashington and North Shields. A former schoolboy international, now 24, whose goalscoring ability played a big part in taking North Shields to their best ever F.A. Cup achievements last season.

MARTIN HENDERSON – A 23 year old winger who was signed just before the start of last season after playing in the Northern League for Durham City and Crook Town. Martin has a good turn of speed and skills to match. As well as making goals for others, he has the ability to score himself as his 15 goals last season testify.

BOB TOPPING – A fine servant of the club since joining in October 1977. This tireless striker netted his 100th goal for the club last new years day, and has now recently become the all time leading scorer for Gateshead club. Top scorer in each of his first four seasons, Bob took virtually no part in the 1981/82 campaign through a serious leg injury but returned last year to score no fewer than 18 goals.

Each selected school will provide a list of 50 pupils. This list will be registered at the Club.

Each child will be issued with a pass for the season for "Gola League" games, together with a lapel badge.

On attendance at the game each child will receive a draw voucher that will be handed back to the Club at the end of the season. This draw voucher will enable the child to participate in a grand draw at the end of the season. Prizes will range from BMX Bicycles to T.V. games and various other prizes.

On production of their pass, the child may be allowed to pay for an adult and for every adult paid for, the child will be issued with a further draw voucher free.

If the child misbehaves his/her membership will be withdrawn and the appropriate school informed.

Complimentary passes can only be used for Gola League Games Only but a draw ticket will be issued free on all cup games.

We regret, however, that there is no admittance to a grandstand seat unless accompanied by an Adult.

From time to time organised trips to special games for Pebbles Members only will be operating subject to demand.

No admittance to games without the Badge and the Pass. Passes are non-transferable.



Some Things Never Change . . .

HAVING just returned from holiday, crestfallen by a plague of three-putting and the supplementing bookmaker's bank accounts, it's always reassuring to know that on the footballing front, you are unlikely to have missed anything of real novelty. The summer months during which the game is supposed to be dormant - unwinding, relaxing, and then preparing for the long season ahead, have provided plenty that has been unhealthily predictable: frenzied player-swapping and callous manager-dumping; a national team tour, which courted adulation in Rio, only to be submersed by the media's customary despondency after Montevideo; and one of those annual anaemic reports on hooliganism which says much, but does little. It's easy to experience a feeling of deja-vu.

Football, I feel, is fast becoming too big and too long for its own good. Its dimensions are saturating the public, and burning out the players on whose ability to entertain it depends. Like a battery, which as it ages progressively takes longer to recharge, the game needs a break, to ensure its effectiveness for the future. Otherwise enthusiasm and appetite will be replaced by apathy and cynicism . . . "What the Football Season already?"

The inevitable lethargy was all too apparent in the showpiece internationals at the tail end of last season. England players, who had either been participating in penalty-infested European club finals, or performing on lucrative but ludicrous 4 day tours of South East Asia, understandably had their fatigue ruthlessly exposed. "The team just isn't good enough," howled Fleet Street after the Russian defeat. A couple of weeks later the tune had changed. One goal of Brazilian quality from John Barnes had suddenly convinced them that England's reserves of potential were not as empty as they had thought.

Barnes, in particular, again showed promise against the Uruguayans, and with a confident and strong-minded referee England might well have won, albeit against a team of seven men. The home defenders were quite unable to distinguish between a black leg and a white ball, so much so that every optician in Montevideo must have been rubbing his hands in anticipation of some brisk business. Oblivious to the fact that every English attack of note had been snuffed out without the merest hint of legality, our boys with the barbed pens and short memories, again offered little hope of our national side ever being able to compete skilfully with the best.

Undoubtedly, a pruning of three or four first division clubs would reduce the present ridiculous volume of matches, leave our best players fresher and fitter, and allow for more frequent squad sessions to improve teamwork and understanding. The potential is there but while the authorities continue to be impervious to reform, it is potential that will remain sinfully untapped. What's more if the quality was improved by decreasing the quantity, as seems likely, attendances would rise and enthusiasm would be rekindled. Sadly, at present, to introduce change into the football league system is about as straight-forward as driving a nail through a blob of mercury.

But before we are all driven to despair, one exception inevitably prevails in the current gloomy climate of no change - the 'Stones as usual have begun the season in their customary solid fashion. Long may their excellent form continue!

Around the Clubs

Runcorn: Runcorn's Travel Club members had a lucky escape on the opening day of the season when their coach suffered a double blow-out on the M20 near Maidstone. Because of the accident, the passengers were unable to see the match. Rugby League is coming to Canal Street this season, Huyton moving to the ground to play under the name Runcorn Highfield.

SCARBOROUGH: Scarborough have signed three more new players in Brian Pollard, formerly of York City, Peter Sutcliffe, who was with Bangor City last season, and Marshall Burke (ex-Lincoln City, Blackburn Rovers and Burnley). Local garage proprietor Barry Boothby has joined the Boro board of directors.

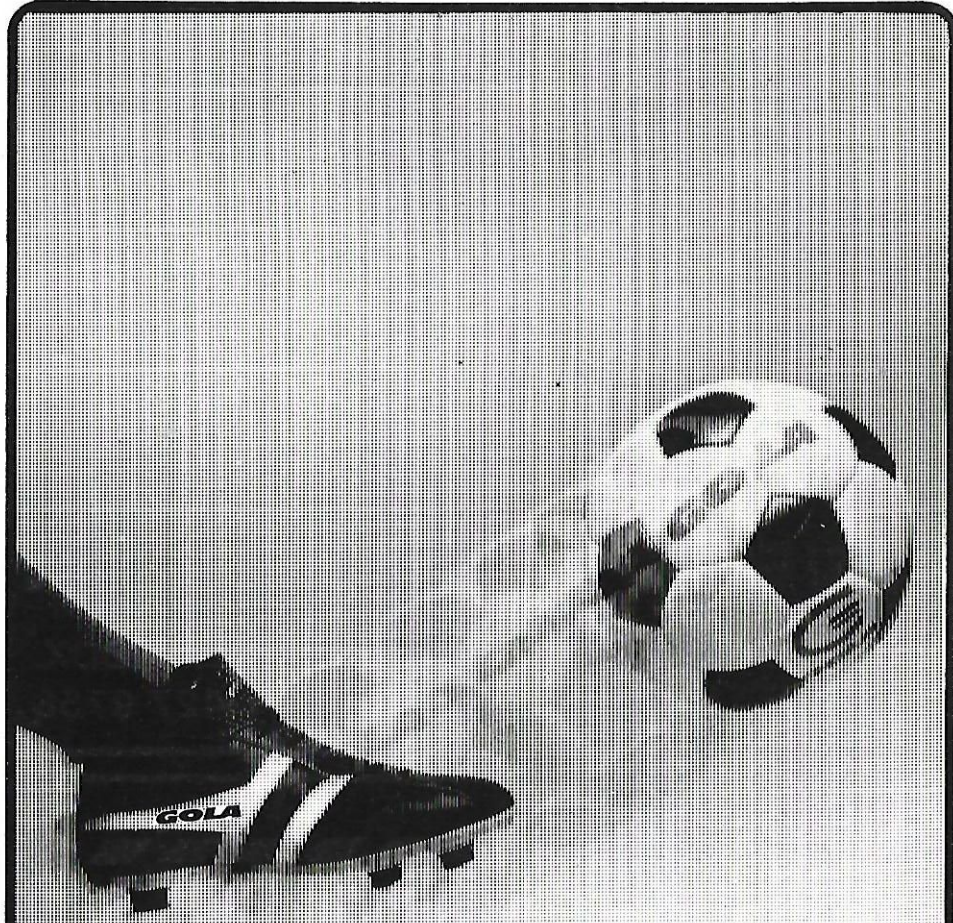

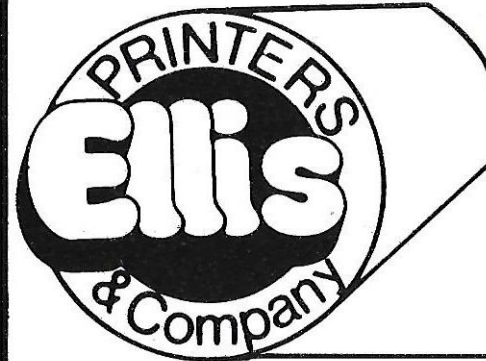

F.A. National School Goes Ahead by COLIN POPE

BY Tuesday September 4th the Duke of Kent will officially declare open the Football Association G.M. National School at Lilleshall.

Although the School has been an idea kicked around for a long long time, the period between the first concrete proposals, and their realisation, has been reasonably short. The FA Council approved the School go-ahead last September provided the necessary finance was forthcoming.

Within a few months the giant General Motors organisation had signed a four year contract, ensuring not only finance for the School, but also bringing support for the FA Coaching and Educational programme as a whole, and for the annual Charity Shield match.

After painstaking selection processes, 25 boys have been offered places and they will take up residence at Lilleshall Hall Sports Centre on Monday.

The School's principal is Mr. Denis Saunders, who has 30 years experience as a master at Malvern College. An amateur international, Denis captained the two Pegasus FA Amateur Cup winning sides in the 1950's. His function at the School will be the control and pastoral care of the boys.

The School's technical work will be under the direction of Dave Sexton, who has been in charge of the England Under-21 team for the past seven years, and a permanent member of the FA Staff.

THE LONG, LONG, TRAIL TO WEMBLEY

THE FA Challenge Cup gets under way again today, with 90 ties in the Preliminary Round. Altogether, 494 clubs will be taking part in this season's competition, compared to 487 in 1983/84, and the Final will be at Wembley on May 18, 1985.

One of the genuine 'minnows' in this season's competition is Steyning Town, third in the Sussex County League last season, and winners of the League Cup. If Hastings Town win their tie at Deal, they will play away to Hastings Utd in the next round. This will be the local derby *par excellence*, as the Town's ground backs on to United's!

Wealdstone, of course, start their campaign on September 15, when we are away to Hounslow in the first qualifying round - a decision by the FA which appears to be odd, to say the least! Yet in the FA Trophy, when we could have had no argument had we lost exemption, we don't come in until the 1st Round!
