## **SIX AWAY POINTS AND WE'RE THE TOPS**

**FANTASTIC!** The visit of league leaders Wealdstone to Worcester City on Saturday attracted a gate of nearly 2,000, and with a sensational 4-0 victory with goals from Gary Donnellan, Alan Cordice, Brian Greenaway and Mark Graves we retained the top Gola League spot, and so maintain our unbeaten record.

Worcester sadly lost their goalkeeper following a first-half accident, but even so, there was no score at the interval. Worcester came at us very strongly early in the second half, and we had to defend considerably – which we did to marvellous effect, our two central defenders, and Roy Davies at right-back being particularly prominent.

Donnellan's goal was a superb solo effort and set us on the right track to score a memorable victory. Again, Wealdstone's superior fitness was evident, and Brian Hall (who must be in the running for the Manager of the Month Award?) has again wound the team up to start so convincingly that morale is running sky-high.

Altogether it has been a great week for us, with a valuable six points being gathered, following our 2-0 win at Yeovil last Wednesday. And if anyone thinks that it was a push-over, as the Somerset side had at that time to register their first league win, could not have been more mistaken.

Indeed, Yeovil looked a good side, but, as so often happens when a side has that sort of record, had nothing going for them in the way of luck, or run of the ball. But we had to fight every inch of the way, and we did just that. The match was highlighted by a stunning goal from Dennis Byatt. Dennis took a free kick only barely inside his own half, and to the amazement of the 1100 spectators rocketted the ball just inside the post, Steve Smith getting a hand to it but being powerless to halt its progress. Earlier Mark Graves had put us ahead with a very forceful header.

It was obvious that Yeovil, on Wednesday's form, would soon start winning and I see they hammered Maidstone handsomely on Saturday!

We've had a lot of questions as to what has happened to Nigel Johnson and Chris Dibble. As is generally known, both have spent the summer playing in Finland, but we are delighted to report that both are now back, and pending the outcome of negotiations with the manager, will be joining our squad which will give us far greater numerical strength than we have had for some time.

Sadly, I personally will have to miss tonight's match, and Saturday's Cup-tie being away in Cornwall, but wish the lads more success.

But before signing off, a word about the FA Cup. I've lost count of the dozens of people who have expressed dire amazement at why Wealdstone, with its excellent FA Cup record in recent seasons, have had to join the competition at such an early stage.

Well, we too, are equally puzzled and dismayed. Although of course we have expressed our sorrow to the Football Association there is no appeal against their decision, and so frankly, we just have to suffer it, and hopefully prove a point this season in the hope that next year we shall gain deserved exemption.

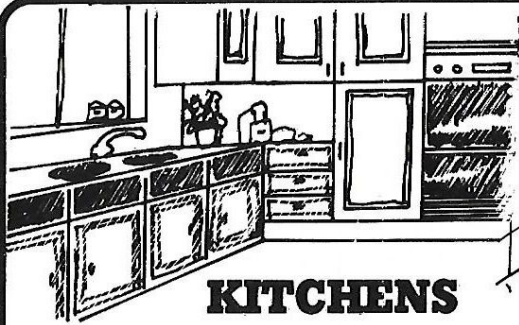

## County Cups aid the 'Minnows' . . .

AS the Middlesex Senior Cup competition enters its 92nd season questions are being asked concerning its role in the packed seasons of the big local clubs. By many fans it is regarded as little more than a nuisance, another factor contributing to the fixture pile-ups hampering the title challenges of our stronger teams season after season. There is also, however, another side to the coin.

The FA Cup and FA Trophy apart, there is a long list of competitions in which Middlesex teams compete; the London Senior Cup, the County Senior & Charity Cups, and the respective competitions for Gola and Isthmian League clubs, the Bob Lord Trophy and the Hitachi Cup. This results in a greater amount of games than other teams in similar leagues play. The title hopes of Harrow Boro and Wealdstone last season were impaired by fixture backlogs leaving them many games behind their rivals and fighting against mounting injury lists. In March, a crucial time in their bid for the Isthmian League title, Boro found themselves without four first teamers. Happily they produced a magnificent level of performance to win the League with almost embarrassing ease, proving that they are two classes ahead of any outfit the Isthmian League can muster. Wealdstone did not fare so well, a squad of 14 players being insufficient material with which to run a football team.

Of all the competitions contributing to these problems, the MSC seems to stand out as the worst. The attendances drop drastically for these ties; Enfield v Wembley produced a crowd of only 250, 400 below the average. Wembley suffered in a different way, having to cancel a match v a Spurs XI in favour of a County Cup match, with a loss of up to £1000 in gate receipts. And since the competition offers no prize money, it is a definite financial burden for the big clubs. Entry in the competition is compulsory due to a County FA rule which states that to be entered for the FA Cup (something which must be done through the MCFA) teams must compete in the Middlesex Senior Cup.

This seemingly harsh rule has good sense behind it. It is a device by the authorities to aid, through the "big guns", the small local sides who form the base and substructure vital to the game at higher levels. It spreads money down through the game to the clubs who feed the Wealdstones and Altrinchams of soccer by providing a highlight in their seasons concerning both prestige and finance.

The large attendances caused by the visits of the top clubs provide a financial lifeline to teams such as Uxbridge, who gained their highest gate of the season for the visit of Harrow Borough, and Wembley, whose first match v. Enfield attracted what was at the time their season's best crowd of 153; and players and supporters of Uxbridge must surely look upon their conquering of Borough as the high spot of the season. This system has a parallel in the F.A. Cup, where the money and publicity received by Telford in their superb cup run must have given the directors enormous satisfaction.

Indeed, a question that must be asked is if the big clubs are shirking their responsibility. The early exits of Wealdstone and Harrow Borough must leave us with slight suspicions, although Hayes reached the semi-final stage, losing to Hendon after a lapse of concentration on the part of goalkeeper Paul Hyde. To counter this, we must hastily point out that up until last season, the recent winners have all been quite large clubs - Enfield, Hayes and Harrow Borough; and Wealdstone have won the competition ten times.

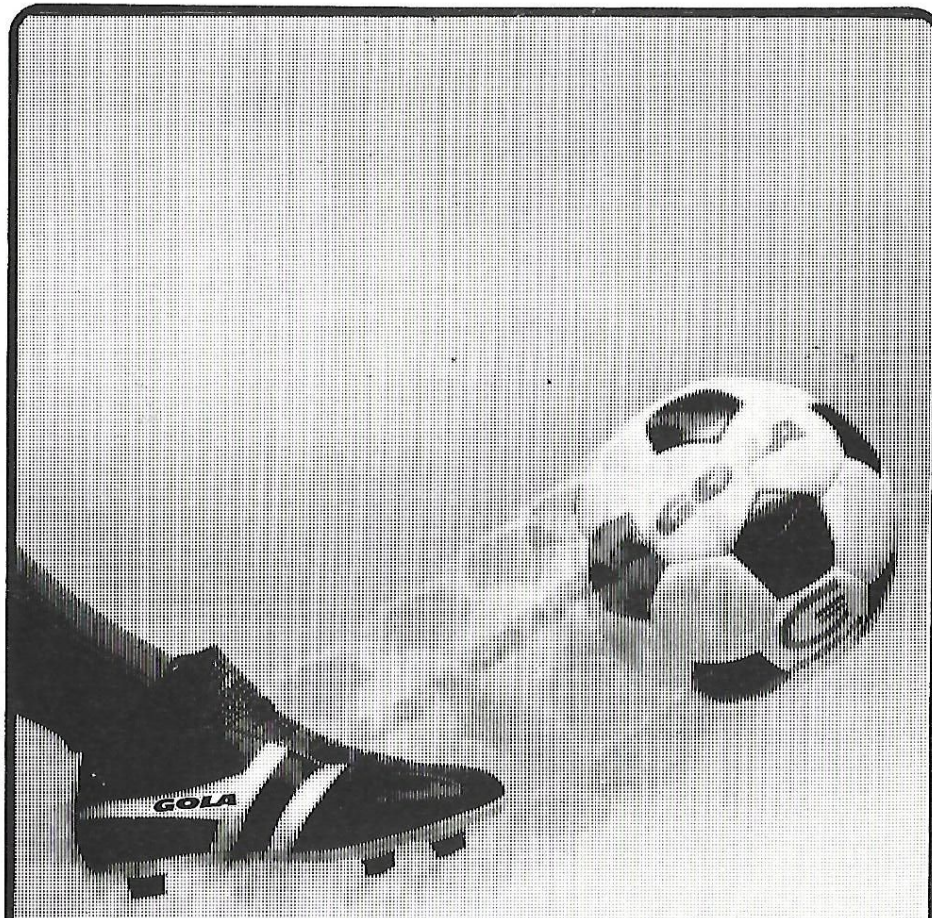

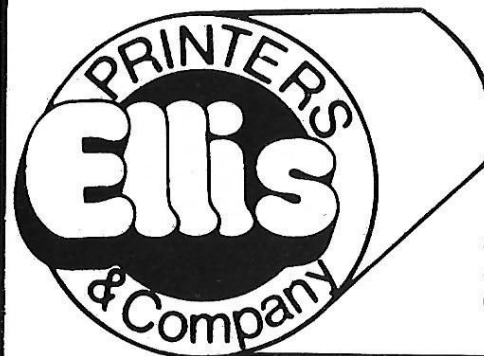

## THE MORRITT HOMES CAPITAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

DURING the past few years the absence of reserve team football here at Wealdstone has caused much comment. How can a team prosper without a reserve side? How can a player regain match fitness after injury without a reserve side? These are just two of many questions that have been asked since we last ran a second eleven.

Our manager Brian Hall has always appreciated the necessity of a reserve team, but is shrewd enough to realise that the standard of football played at this level must be conducive to players hoping to appear in the first team. You will recall that we used to have a reserve team in the Suburban League but with the greatest respect the wide gap in standard between that league and the now named Gola League meant that there was little benefit for our club at all. Attempts were made to enter other leagues of a higher standard but regrettably these failed.

However, three years of careful thought, clever planning, hard negotiating, and liaison with other clubs by Brian Hall plus enormous quantities of paperwork by Peter Braxton have now proved worthwhile with the birth of the :-

### MORRITT HOMES CAPITAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

The league which commences next month will consist of the following eight clubs - Wimbledon, Orient, Brentford and Gillingham from the Cannon League, and Barnet, Enfield Dagenham and Wealdstone from the Gola League.

The League has been fully sanctioned by the Football Association and a management committee and officers have been duly elected. Ken Wiltshire has been elected Chairman, Brian Hall - Vice Chairman and Peter Braxton - Secretary.

Obviously, in this day and age it is essential that football clubs such as those listed above only undertake schemes that will not lead to them making a loss at the end of the day. By applying this principle it has been agreed that the format of the league will be:-

- 1) Each team will play each other team once.
- 2) When the match is between two Cannon League teams the match will be played on either club's ground with home advantage being alternated season to season.
- 3) This principle will also apply to matches between Gola league clubs.
- 4) When a Gola League club plays a Cannon League club the Gola club will always be at home.

It was felt that potentially the Gola clubs would achieve far better gates when entertaining a Cannon League team than vice-versa.

During the rest of the season we at Wealdstone trust that you our supporters will help to make this venture a great success.

Brian Hall, as already mentioned, has strived for a long time to set the league up and when, on the 16th October, we play Brentford here at Lower Mead, in our opening Morrith Homes Capital Football League fixture it will be for him a dream realised.

As you can see by the title of the League, the Company of our own Chairman, David Morrith, have graciously agreed to sponsor the League during its first season and everyone connected with the League is deeply indebted to Morrith Homes, for their most generous gesture.

More information will be given in following programmes but for now we list the opening fixtures which will be played during October with dates to be agreed between the participating clubs. Wealdstone
