THE MORRITT HOMES CAPITAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

DURING the past few years the absence of reserve team football here at Wealdstone has caused much comment. How can a team prosper without a reserve side? How can a player regain match fitness after injury without a reserve side? These are just two of many questions that have been asked since we last ran a second eleven.

Our manager Brian Hall has always appreciated the necessity of a reserve team, but is shrewd enough to realise that the standard of football played at this level must be condusive to players hoping to appear in the first team. You will recall that we used to have a reserve team in the Suburban League but with the greatest respect the wide gap in standard between that league and the now named Gola League meant that there was little benefit for our club at all. Attemr is were made to enter other leagues of a higher standard but regrettably these failed.

However, three years of careful thought, clever planning, hard negotiating, and liaison with other clubs by Brian Hall plus enormous quantities of paperwork by Peter Braxton have now proved

worthwhile with the birth of the :-

MORRITT HOMES CAPITAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

The league which commences next month will conist of the following eight clubs - Wimbledon. Orient, Brentford and Gillingham from the Cannon League, and Barnet, Enfield Dagenham and Wealdstone from the Gola League.

The League has been fully sanctioned by the Football Association and a management committee and officers have been duly elected. Ken Wiltshire has been elected Chairman, Brian Hall - Vice Chairman and Peter Braxton - Secretary.

Obviously, in this day and age it is essential that football clubs such as those listed above only undertake schemes that will not lead to them making a loss at the end of the day. By applying this principle it has been agreed that the format of the league will be:-

Each feam will play each other team once.

When the match is between two Cannon League teams the match will be played on either club's ground with home advantage being alternated season to season.

This principle will also apply to matches between Gola league clubs.

When a Gola League club plays a Cannon League club the Gola club will always be at

It was felt that potentially the Gola clubs would achieve far better gates when entertaining a Cannon League team than vice-versa.

During the rest of the season we at Wealdstone trust that you our supporters will help to make this venture a great success.

Brian Hall, as already mentioned, has strived for a long time to set the league up and when, on the 16th October, we play Brentford here at Lower Mead, in our opening Morritt Homes Capital Football League fixture it will be for him a dream realised.

As you can see by the title of the League, the Company of our own Chairman, David Morritt, have graciously agreed to sponsor the League during its first season and everyone connected with the League is deeply indebted to Morritt Homes, for their most generous gesture.

STONES SHOP NEWS

THE long-awaited copies of the F.A. Non-League Directory 1985 have been received ahead of schedule from the publishers and compare most favourably with last year's more expensive Rothmans production. Supporters who have ordered their copies may call at the club shop to collect them, but in view of the sizeable cost of the annuals there are NO spare copies for those who did not heed our previous request to place a firm order. In a volume of over 600 pages there will inevitably be found a few errors, but it is strange how in recent issues Wealdstone seem to be picked out in particular! This year's copy gives Nigel Johnson as our leading goalscorer last season without a mention of the second top scorer in the whole Alliance, Mark Graves. Our second highest marksman was Paul Bennett (??) if we were to believe the Directory! Congratulations also to Kingsbury Town who have surprisingly found a place in the Gola League – quite rapid progress for a side who have only just made the Isthmian League in reality! Joking apart the annual is an excellent read and a credit to the Editor Tony Williams and his new unsponsored publishers.

Current season's Gola League and Football League programmes are growing in availability in the club shop. Selections of programmes from other Non-League clubs have been arriving from all parts of the country including a number from those formidable Northern Leaguers, Blyth Spartans whose lapel badges are now available here also.

Several of the "bargain bundles" of Wealdstone programmes have been snapped up and more have been made up to cater for the continuing demand. Whilst stocks last, fifty assorted programmes spanning ten years or so of Wealdstone home games can be obtained for just 25p. A number of older Wealdstone programmes dating back to the 1950s are also on offer to serious collectors. A dealer paid us £7 recently for two friendly programmes from the mid-fifties against the famous old club, Pegasus, so donations of old programmes from supporters can be seen to be of great use to the club shop.

Tony Turner: Birmingham-born full-back signed from Nuneaton Borough in February 1981. A consistent defender, he is aged 31 and lives in Hednesford.

David Barnett: Midfield player signed during the 1980/81 season from Stafford Rangers; aged 24, he has also represented Oldham and Bangor City and lives in Ellesmere Port.

Paul Mayman: Midfield player who entered part-time football for career purposes after making 43 appearances for Crewe Alexandra. Signed from Northwich in October 1981, he holds two England semi-professional caps, Aged 26, he lives in Nantwich.

Colin Williams: Goalscorer of proven quality in his second spell at Telford, he re-signed in January 1983 from Scarborough, having also represented Northwich in the intervening period. A regular member of the England semi-pro squad, he is aged 28 and lives in Manchester.

Dean Edwards: 22 year-old forward who has had League experience with Shrewsbury Town. A native of Wolverhampton, he has also represented Port Vale and Worcester City and, during close seasons in England, plays for Vaasan Palloseura in Finland.

Eddie Hogan: 27 year-old Dublin-born midfielder who commenced his career at Derby County and has also represented Burton Albion, Redditch United and Nuneaton Borough. Lives at West Hallam, Derbyshire.

John Stringer: recently signed winger from Runcom in whom several Leggue clubs have expressed interest, aged 20, lives in Weavesham, Cheshire.

David Mather: Striker signed from Bangor City early in 1980, since when he has been α consistent goalscorer. Aged 33, he was born and lives in Liverpool.


