IT would be stupid to pretend that our defeat at Gray's Athletic last Saturday was anything but a disaster of considerable magnitude – both in terms of finance and prestige. And, of course, unless we have a really good run in the Trophy, it means we shall again next season have to join the early F.A. Cup qualifying rounds – which upset us a lot this season in view of our good Cup runs in the last few seasons

Mind you, we have been in good company, for Runcorn went out to Leek Town, a Cheshire County League side in the first round, while only last Saturday Bath City also took an early exit at the hands of Frome Town, from the Western League.

Still, as manager Brian Hall rightly states, regrettable though it is, we've got to put it behind us,

Our wounds received a substantial dose of healing balm on Tuesday, of course, when our inaugural match in the new Morritt Homes Capital League resulted in us perpetrating grevious bodily harm to Brentford in the shape of a mind-boggling 10-0 victory!

I know our team found a lot of space that just wouldn't be there in the Gola League, and allowing for the fact that Brentford's side was made up of reserves and youth team players, we really did look sharp, and scored some wonderful goals which would not have disgraced 'Match of the Day'.

STOP PRESS.... Will all our Supporters please note that we shall now be AT HOME TO BARROW NEXT SATURDAY, OCTOBER 27th (3 00 pm) in a League game, instead of travelling to Runcorn. This was arranged yesterday (Friday) morning, when it was also agreed that we go to Runcorn on April 13.

And we were very much heartened by a bigger gate than anticipated – and how fitting that they were rewarded by such a goal-scoring spree. On target for us were: Lee Holmes (3), Chris Dibble (2), Gary Donnellan (2), and Nigel Johnson, Vince Jones and Mark Graves one each.

It might seem odd mentioning any particular player on Tuesday, but I think it only fair to comment on the tremendous season Gary Donnellan is having. He's now arguably the fastest man in the squad, and is playing as well as at any time in his career. He's undoubtedly given us a new dimension on the left side with his penetrating runs, and pin-point crosses, and his exceptional competitive edge wins a lot of 50-50 balls. One can sense the buss of anticipation of supporters now every time he starts one of his dazzling runs!

Our Brentford-bashing, though, did have its sombre side with the removal to hospital of Nigel Johnson. Happily, no bones were broken although his ligament trouble will keep him side-lined for a month or so. So with Nigel, Bob Iles and Steve McCargo, we're carrying three time-consuming invites

Incidentally, to save you staticians from racing to your record books, I'll tell you that we have to go back to 1955 since we had a similar win to Tuesday – when on that occasion we beat Metropolitan Police 12-1 in a friendly! And 44 years ago – in 1940 – we beat Gillingham by the same margin, 10-0. This was the same score by which we beat Barking in the Athenian League in 1931, and also that year we beat Thame Utd 12-4 in the F.A. Cup! But in recent decades, Tuesday's goal riot was the best!

As many of you will know, Gray's Athletic are now at home to Dartford in the 4th qualifying round – a real local Derby, and the Gola League side would not really have wished for this one! Meanwhile, our near-neighbours and rivals, Harrow Borough, exempt until the 4th round next Saturday, visit Kettering. After a shaky start they are getting the right results now. Incidentally, a whisper reaches me that the Borough's sites are now set on the Gola League . . . True or false, I wonder?

Gola League secretary Peter Hunter, here on Tuesday with other soccer luminaries such as Wimbledon's chairman, tells me he has a strong hunch that Enfield will win the championship this season. He's seen them two or three times this season and says thay made some excellent signings during the close season, and are looking really good. Reckon Paul Bowgett and his lads may have something to say about that, however!

Encourage – Not Destroy

STONES SHOP NEWS

THERE are still a few supporters who have not yet collected their F.A. Non-League Directories from the Club Shop. Messrs. Mason, Fuller, Fletcher, Groves and Geere – your copies await, you! Mr. Rose – your copy will be on first come, first served basis if you don't come and pay for it soon!

The new issues of both "Programme Monthly" and "West Middlesex Review" have arrived and can be obtained for 60p and 25p respectively. The next issue of both "Non-League Digest" and "Pyramid Magazine" are also awaited and hopefully will have arrived by today for sale. Both these latter publications have been sell-outs so far this season, so be sure to get in first to secure a copy. It is interesting to see that "West Middlesex Review" has taken account of Ruislip Manor F.C. in place of Hayes F.C. due to general apathy and disinterest from the Isthmian Premier outfit. It is sad to find a club whose own supporters are not sufficiently keen to read about their own club, especially after all the effort put into the venture by the young editorial committee. Let's hope that Ruislip Manor's fans do not find a modest 25p a month excessive to read about their club!

In contrast to the above, a great deal of enthusiasm and endeavour has been required during the summer months at clubs following the dissolution of the Athenian League. Several of the twenty clubs that had to find new Leagues to join decided that progress was their key objective and had to work like mad to satisfy the high requirements of the Isthmian League ground committee. Some clubs found the task beyond them or decided that the effort was not worthwhile. These clubs filtered into the Spartan, Combined Counties, Eastern Counties and South Midlands leagues. Amongst those clubs who followed the option of aiming higher at inclusion in the new South and North sections of the Isthmian League, Division Two was Banstead Athletic whose Chairman, Malcolm Baker, is a producer and supplier to us on many of the high quality lapel badges in our Club Shop. The Isthmian committee were so sure that Banstead would fail to get their ground into shape by their deadline that they considered a further visit unnecessary. But Banstead's supporters, officials and even the players got together during the summer, assessed their individual skills and trades. and combined on a building programme that would make our own Chairman proud! Concreting, bricklaying, drain-laying and pipe-laying was organised in record time and utterly astounded the Isthmian committee when they returned merely out of courtesy! The result - an Isthmian place for Banstead and one up for the spirit of Non-League football!

It is ironical that recent comments and pleas in the Wealdstone programme concerning bad language have come at a time when the most obvious culprit has been conspicuous by his absence. Equally disturbing and amazing bearing in mind our position at the top of the Gola League is the way in which some so-called supporters do not waste a moment in vehemently criticising the least mistake made by a player. A poem appeared in last week's Watford v. Coventry programme entitled "Ode to a Muppet" which specifically highlighed the type of supporter that every club has to suffer. The type of "fan" who shouts abuse at a substitue who comes on cold and puts his first pass astray; the type who will cheer a striker's goals week after week but but hesitate to yell foul-mouthed criticism at the same player if a chance is missed or the ball not controlled. Perhaps only the players themselves and the loyal band who travel all over the country encouraging the Stones and supporting in the true sense will know just how much more beneficial a shout of "Well tried! Never mind! Keep at it!" is after some poor play rather than violent abuse which can only inhibit a player and lead to more errors.

Wealdstone's superb away support has been a major ingredient in our enviable away record. If the team is to go all the way and capture the title, the players need constant encouragement during bad spells as well as good. Let's all get 100% behind the lads and there is no reason why we cannot reach our deserved position at the top of the pyramid on Non-League football.

F.A. PLAN UNDER FIRE

THE Gola, Servowarm Isthmian, Southern, Northern and Northern Premier Leagues are up in arms at the proposed FA plan to change the basis of selection of full member clubs.

Under the proposal only clubs in the Premier Division of the five leagues would be allowed to enjoy full membership - which threatens loss of status for nearly 90 clubs in lower leagues or

Principal plank in the FA's argument for change is to end the present system of disciplinary procedures. At present full member clubs are dealt with by the FA, while associate members report to County FA's. A player with a full member club is subject to the FA's points system and might be banned for only one or two matches. Players with associate clubs, up before their County FA can often be banned for much longer for the same offence.

Most leagues accept that this injustice should end, but are committed to fighting the suggestion that clubs outside the top divisions should lose their full member status.

Several famous clubs - Corinthian Casuals, Bromley, Oxford City, Woking and Kingstonian immediately spring to mind as victims if the proposal is adopted. 17 Southern League clubs stand to lose their status.


