STONES SQUAD IN THE MONEY!

WE give below the final tally of clubs to share in the Gola League's first £2,500 jackpot pool up to the end of September:

One share each – Altrincham, Boston, Dartford, Gateshead, Kidderminster, Maidstone, Runcom, Telford.

Two shares each - Barnet, Dagenham, Frickley, Nuneaton

Three shares each - Wealdstone, Enfield, Worcester

Four shares - Weymouth

At the outset of the season, it was not made entirely clear whether the Bob Lord Trophy was to be included, but it was thought not. If this is so, the total of shares is 29 – working out at £86.20 per share (with a few odd pence left over!) Thus Wealdstone's share – which goes to the players – is a handy £250 plus.

We're obviously doing extremely well again for October, and up to today we lead the way with 32 goals, followed by Enfield's 29 and Weymouth's 28. In the current month's jackpot pool we have one share in company with Dartford, Kettering, Nuneaton, Worcester and Scarborough. Pace setters are Barrow and Barnet with two shares each.

It is with considerable pleasure today that we welcome back Steve Perkins, making his first appearance for many months following a severe ankle injury. Steve has been in hard training for some weeks now, and it is a boon that he is considered ready for action now that we have lost the capable Steve McCargo for some weeks, although Steve's foot is already out of plaster.

I'd like to remind you that we are at home to Wimbledon on Tuesday in the Morritt Homes Capital League, while on Tuesday week, November 6 we entertain the redoubtable Enfield in the Bob Lord Trophy, both matches 7.30 pm.

It may come as a shock to many people that our visitors today, Barrow A.F.C. have their very own London-based National Supporters Club! Well, they do, and a Mr. John Woods, of south-west London, has supplied me with full details!

They were formed in 1977 by a group of Barrow supporters living in the London area, and now has a membership of almost 100, paying £2 a head membership. A monthly newsletter is published, and travel to Saturday matches arranged at advantageous rates. Regular social occasions are held, and if any of our own Supporters wish to make contact, the person to telephone is Dave Leitch on 01-399 3343.

Congratulations to Barrow on being the only unbeaten Gola League side, and please note that their midweek 1-1 draw with Scarborough attracted a huge gate of 1,721 to their Holker Street ground – the highest in the League to date. And do you notice that Yeovil, notwithstanding their appalling record, have still not yet dropped below 1,000! Wonder what it will take for us to reach four figures this season?

A reminder of our great Bonfire Night fireworks display on the ground on Monday, November 5th when we hope you will turn up with the kids in large numbers. Admission is only £1, and 60p for children and senior citizens, and the gates open at 6.30 pm with the display starting at 7.30 pm. Ample refreshements will be available. And as a bonus, Toby Jackson's superb Club Shop will be open, and he has a lot of material which will keep the youngsters quiet while waiting for the 'big bang'.

If any individual or Company would care to sponsor a match ball, the Club would be delighted. Match balls cost £35 and we have to have a new one for every match, of course. Any takers?

Around the Clubs

Altrincham have transferred winger Don Page to Stafford Rangers for a small fee. Page, who spent two seasons with the Robins, was recently on loan to Stafford.

Barnet Financial problems have caused Barnet to release defender Ian Bolton, the former Watford and Brentford player. Despite serious injury problems - Steve Mahoney and Stewart Atkins have only recently returned to the side, whilst Bill Baldry, Steve Turner and Nicky Evans are still sidelined - Barnet qualified for shares in the Gola Goal Monthly Jackpot for four successive matches up to their 3-1 defeat at Frickley last Saturday.

Boston United have re-signed defender Mick Lyon from United Counties League side Stamford. Lyon had made the right-back position his own at Yourk Street last season before moving to Stamford, whom he helped to the F.A. Vase Final at Wembley in May. The Pilgrims normally train at a sports centre near Newark but, on Wednesday, this was held as an open training evening for supporters and the media at their York Street ground.

Yeovil Town striker Mick Doherty has moved to neighbours Weymouth for an £8,000 fee. The Terras had earlier offered striker Gerry Pearson and cash for Doherty, but Huish boss Gerry Gow was not interested in Pearson as he had already signed Torquay United's ex-Barnet striker Colin Barnes for a £3,000 fee. Maidstone United also attempted to sign Doherty, who scored 25 goals in 34 appearances for Yeovil last season after joining the club from Slough Town. Another striker to join the Somerset side last week was ex-Bristol City player Paul Cheesley, whose Football League career was ended by a chronic knee injury after helping City into the First Division.




