GOLA CLUBS SHINE IN F.A. CUP... by Colin Pope

HEARTIEST congratulations to Gola League clubs Enfield, Altrincham, Northwich Victoria, Dartford, Telford Utd and Frickley Athletic on reaching the second round of the F.A. Cup. At the time of writing this column, the result of the Swindon v Dagenham replay was not known, but apparently the Football League side were very lucky indeed to even get a second chance.

What can one say of Enfield? They had a poorish time last season, of course, after winning the title the previous year but it would seem that one season out of the limelight is all this progressive club can stand, and we pay tribute to manager Eddie McCluskey. He made a couple or so most astute signings which has taken our near neighbours right up there again in the public eye. Their 3-0 drubbing of Exeter on Monday was great stuff for the Gola League. Even high-riding Millwall on their own patch cannot be over-confident for the next round.

Mind you, the result of the round must surely be Altrincham's win at Blackpool at the first attempt, and it will not have escaped your notice that they now head the league table, followed by Enfield

with ourselves third.

Although the result seems to suggest that we only scraped through at Rayners Lane last Saturday in the Middlesex Senior Cup, winning 3-2, we did in fact win comfortably, and did all we had to do to go through. And it must be remembered that we have a quite appalling injury list. On this subject, sad to say Steve McCargo has had a little bit of a relapse in his good progress and may not be back quite as soon as we had hoped. Meanwhile all our other injured lads are making good progress but it will be sometime yet before we have a full squad to choose from.

Meanwhile we heartily welcome Andy Graham, who has recently joined us from Lancaster City, of the Northern League. A tall well-built striker. Andy was previously with Hyde Utd, the Cheshire club and one imagines that manager Brian Hall will give him a run-out for the visit of Orient on Monday in the Morritt Homes Capital League (7.30 pm). Andy has looked impressive in training.

It is by now universally known that the ever-popular Dennis Byatt is in the midst of a dreadful family tragedy. Dennis's wife Dorothy recently lost the baby she was expecting, and tragically Dorothy is now herself fighting for life on a life-support machine in Hillingdon Hospital. This news has shocked every single person alike, and our

heartfelt prayers go out to Dennis and Dorothy.

We lost at Bath recently, and so we not only have an old score to settle, but many scores to settle, for if any club really did have a bogey team, we have in Bath City! For some reason they seem to have an Indian sign over us, but frankly, we cannot really afford not to come good against them today — not only for the points, but from the morale point-of-view to halt a depressing run of results. Having such an injury list, we badly need a shot in the arm and a win today will keep us well to the fore in the table. Especially as we have a tough one next Saturday when we travel to Weymouth.

What about little Bognor and their stunning 4,000 gate, quite apart from their victory? Makes you sick, doesn't it!!

Around the Clubs

Boston United have signed 31-year-old defender Mike Czuczman from Lincolnshire League leaders Skegness Town. Previously, Czuczman had had a lengthy Football League career with Grimsby Town (two spells), Scunthorpe United, Stockport County and York City.

Scarborough's appointment of Harry Dunn as player/manager following the sacking of John Cottam is a remarkable turnaround for the popular 36-year-old, for he had spent nearly 20 years at the club until released by Cottam 18 months ago. Dunn admits he never expected to return to Seamer Road after his shock release, but he believes his brief spell at Frickley and an even shorter period as caretaker manager at Boro before the arrival of Cottam has given him the necessary experience to get Scarborough back to what they were five to ten years ago. Dunn (who even turned out for Boro on his wedding day) is the only player to have received two benefits with the club in its 100-year history.

If any supporter has a spare copy of either the Enfield or Worcester away programme, I'd be very grateful!

Well, the son of a certain Joe Fagan earned a notable triumph for the Gola League at Blackpool, so I'm returning home content. Only ex-Chelsea man Ian Britton showed any devotion to Blackpool's cause whereas Altrincham's Phil Gardner seemed to take on the Seasiders single-handed (and win!) in the first half which saw "Alty" snatch their winning goal. Let's hope that it is our

turn next year to fly the Gola flag and grab F.A. Cup glory!


