

Introducing Altrincham

TREVOR DANCE: After making over 100 Football League appearances for Port Vale, Durham born Dance moved into Alliance Premier League football with Stafford Rangers who paid £10,000 for his signature. After 150 appearances during a three-year stay, he joined Altrincham in October 1983, quickly becoming a vital member of the side.

DAVID CONSTANTINE: Began his career in the Cheshire League with Hyde United before moving into the Football League with Bury who paid £6,500. He made 70 League appearances whilst at Gigg Lame before joining Altrincham in the summer of 1982. Last season he was voted "Player of the Year" by Altrincham's Supporters Association.

JOHN DAVISON: No player has passed Davison's total of 18 England appearances at Semi-Professional International level in the six years since the team was created and he has found the net five times for his Country. He first joined the "Robins" from Bumley in the 1971-72 season and had a short spell with Bangor City five years later before returning to Moss Lane. He has also played representative football for the British Universities and the Northern Premier League.

ELFYN EDWARDS: After spells with both Wrexham and Tranmere Rovers, he starred in Runcom's Alliance Premier League Championship winning side and won the Club's "Player of the Year" award, before moving to Altrincham last close season.

PAUL CUDDY: A 25 year old who joined Altrincham in October 1981 after two and a half years at Chorley. He had played for a number of Lancashire Football League Clubs before joining Rochdale where he stayed for two years, making one Fourth Division appearance, and then moved on to Huddersfield Town and Bolton Wanderers.

PHIL GARDNER: A 22 year old Liverpool born player who graduated from Liverpool University and is now on a teacher training course. He joined Everton straight from school and played in their youth and 'A' teams before joining Altrincham in October 1981. He quickly gained a First Team place and has been a regular in the side ever since.

GARY ANDERSON: Began his career with Altrincham and spent two seasons at Moss Lane before joining South Liverpool at the start of last season. After playing an important role in South Liverpool's best ever Northern Premier League season and winning medals in three different Cup Finals he returned to Moss Lane in the close season.

PETER CONNING: A former England schoolboy International who joined Liverpool, before moving on to Wigan Athletic. Signed for Altrincham late last season and showed great promise in a number of appearances in the closing games, but he has now made a First Team place his own after some sparkling displays and already a number of First Division Clubs have made enquiries about this 19 year old Liverpool University Student.

JEFF JOHNSON: Jeff joined Altrincham from Hyde United in 1976 after playing for Stockport County earlier that year. Originally a striker he moved into a midfield role in the 1979/80 season and the change proved so successful that he has represented England in the last four Semi-Professional International Tournaments. He was voted as Altrincham's "Player of the Year" by Supporters in both 1977-78 and 1979-80 and has now made 12 International appearances, scoring three goals.

GRAHAM BENNETT: Cardiff-born Bennett broke the Northern Premier League's individual scoring record with 53 goals in the 1981-82 season for Bangor City and joined Altrincham in the following close season. He started his career in the Southern League with Barry Town before moving on the Bridgend Town where he scored 92 goals in three and a half seasons and won a Southern League Division One North Championship medal. He has finished both his seasons with Altrincham as the Club's top scorer and has now scored over 50 goals in 80 full appearances.

MICK FAGAN: Son of the Liverpool Manager Joe Fagan, Mick signed for Altrincham during the close season. A former Burscough player, he was with Runcom for a brief period towards the end of last season and has also played for Macclesfield Town.

RONNIE ELLIS: Began his career in the Cheshire League with Burscough and then Winsford United before moving into the Alliance Premier League with Runcom. He signed for the "Robins", initially on loan, towards the end of the 1982-83 season and was a regular in the side until he broke his leg earlier this season.
