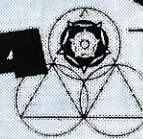

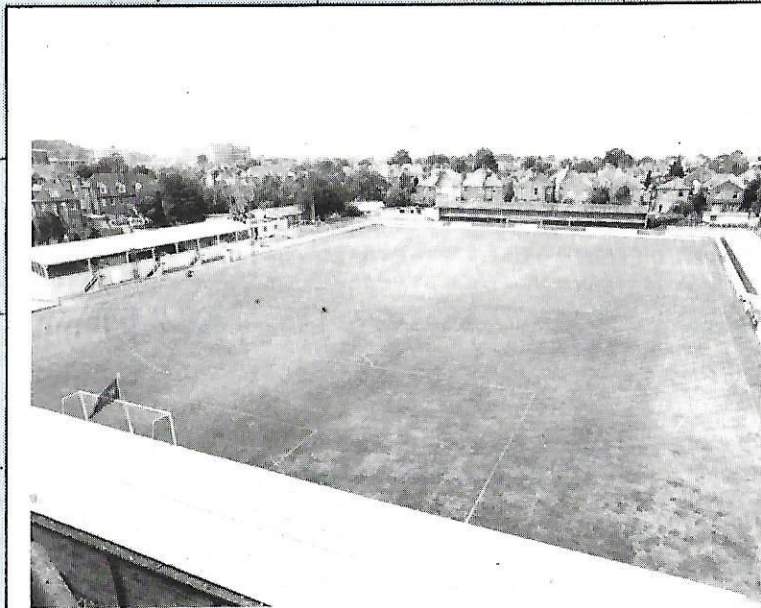

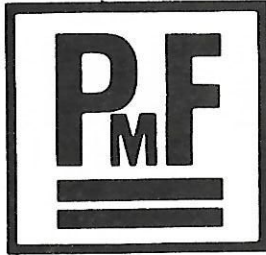

PART-TIMERS BRIDGE THE GAP

RECENT FA Cup results have again proved that the best clubs in semi-professional football are more than a match for those from the third division of the Canon League.

The victory over Swansea City by Bognor Regis Town, who are near the bottom of the Isthmian League premier division, was a genuine upset. Those of the four other clubs — to have knocked out League opposition can be seen as part of a continuing trend in recent seasons.

As the accompanying table shows, all four Gola League clubs have won more FA Cup games over the last nine seasons against third and fourth division clubs than they have lost. Telford's record is particularly worth noting: of their 10 matches they have lost only once, away to Tranmere Rovers in a replay two seasons ago. Enfield have not been beaten in seven matches against fourth division opponents, Altrincham have lost only one out of 10.

The statistics add weight to the argument that there should be automatic promotion and relegation between the Gola League and the fourth division. The facilities at most Gola League grounds are similar to those in the fourth division and the clubs are now consistently proving that their playing standards are equally high. Moreover, the Gola League clubs have achieved all this with part-time players and without the financial benefits of Canon League membership (pools, television and other shared funds are worth some £100,000 per season).

Eddie McCluskey, the Enfield manager, believes the recession has been an important factor in bridging the gap. "Most players at our level aren't interested in joining a third or fourth division club", he said. "They have jobs outside football and with the money they earn as part-time players they do just as well financially if not better than third or fourth division players.

"The job security as a professional footballer is also very poor, particularly in the lower divisions. Clubs have cut their playing staffs right back. In the summer I had the chance to sign several ex-professionals, but generally I'm not interested in that sort of player. Too many former professionals think they can have an easy time playing at our level.

"One or two of my team have had experience with professional clubs but most of them have only been at non-League level. Yet anyone who saw us beat Exeter would agree we were by far the superior team.

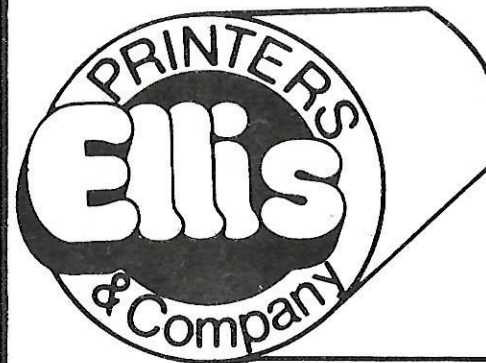

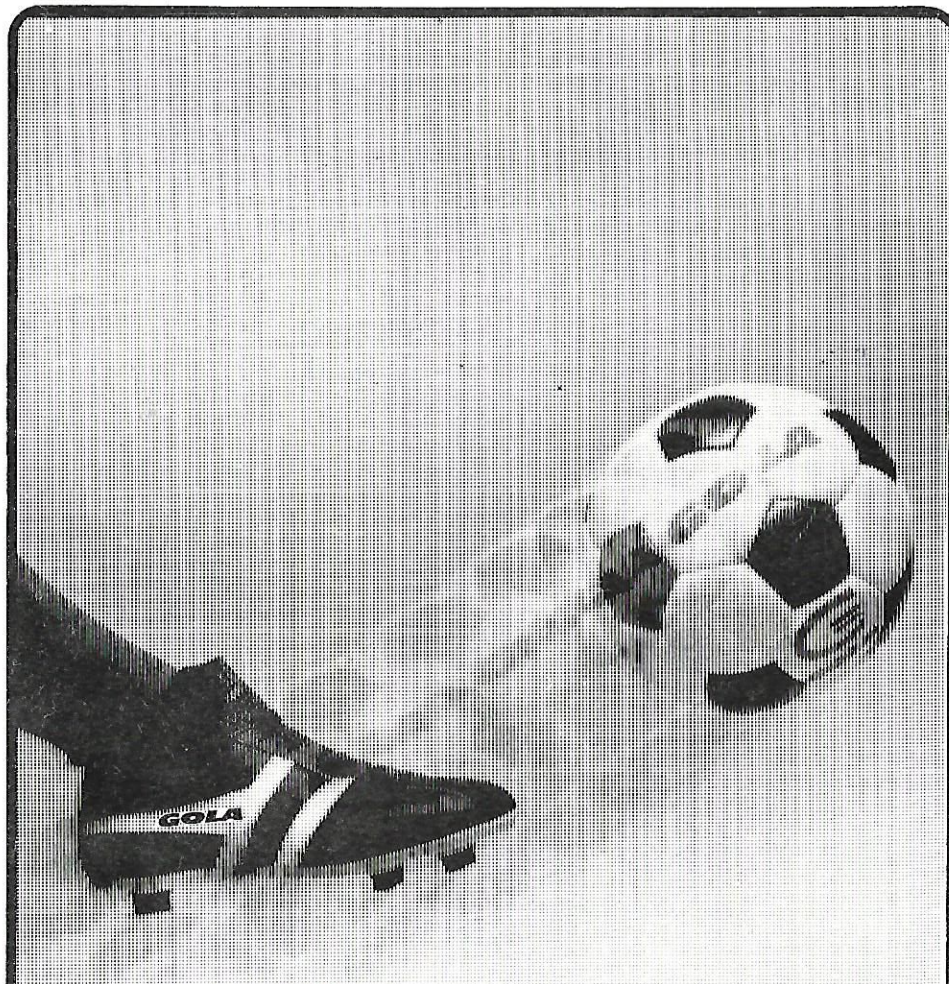

“Ooooh Butch”

CLICHES and puns apart, England's recent 8-0 roasting of Turkey proved conclusively that we now have a national side to be proud of. Just think what would have happened if we'd have fielded a full-strength team, or even if we'd been able to have more than just one training session before the game. It could have turned the rout into a Turkish massacre not seen since the Siege of Vienna in 1699. (It's marvellous what A-level History will do for you). Indeed, as one wag remarked, "I haven't seen Turkey stuffed like that since Egon Roncy's first good food guide."

Several interesting facets of England's performance commanded the attention; notably Ray Wilkins' emergence, not only as team playmaker, but also as chief cuddler. The acid test would have come if Peter Withe had accepted two very presentable chances in the second half. Would Wilkins have shown such affection to a man whose face looks remarkably like that of a werewolf? Perhaps Withe muffed those chances deliberately. Could it be that he knows something we don't?

And what does Mrs. Wilkins or indeed Mrs. Whitehouse think of all this unhealthy kissing and cuddling? Has Boy George's influence finally permeated to the England football team?

Anyhow, come February 27th next year at Windsor Park, Belfast, stand by for the first England goal; (on current form, with a settled side there shouldn't be long to wait); enter Wilkins stage left, eyes-a-glow, arms outstretched, pulse-a-racing, pining to engulf the scorer.

Just think if they were playing at Highbury, it could be replayed on the giant video screen, backed perhaps, with a touch of lilting Tchaikovsky. "Ooooh Butch"

JON SILLE - Midfield: Age 25. Signed for Maidstone from Dagenham in July 1984. He has also played for Hertford Town and St. Albans City.

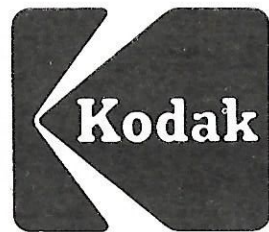

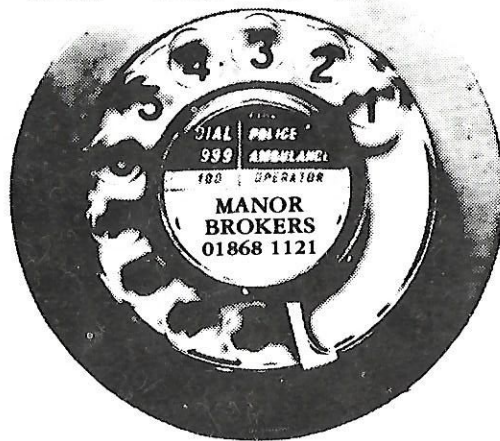
