

GARY LESTER Goalkeeper: Aged 29. Has been first choice 'keeper at Loakes Park since joining from Chalfont St. Peter in December 1979. At 6ft 2inches is the tallest member of the squad and agile with it.

KEVIN TILLEY Defender: Aged 26. Signed from Hayes at the start of this years campaign. Previous clubs include Aylesbury United, Q.P.R., Maidstone United and a successful five year spell at Wimbledon.

GRAHAM PEARCE Defender: Aged 23. A speedy winger who has now made the conversion to full-back. Came through from the reserves last season and is a promising prospect. In his second spell with the club and played for the Wycombe youth side in 1977/78.

DAVE BURGESS Defender: Aged 27. Signed from Oxford City in the close season where he made close to 150 appearances. Previously with Kidlington and Banbury United and has gained representative honours for the F.A. and Hellinic League. Has played cricket for Oxfordshire.

ANTON VIRCAVS Defender: Aged 23. Commanding central defender who signed from Hellinic League side Pressed Steel in January 1981.

KEVIN COLLINS Midfield: Aged 21. At Staines Town last season and has recently been playing with Port Hacking in Australia. Joined the Blues in November this season.

KEN WILSON Forward: Aged 28. Missed much of last season with a knee injury. A favourite at Loakes Park and his varied wing play was badly missed by the Blues. Previous clubs include Hounslow Town and Walton & Hersham.

SIMON READ Forward: Aged 23. The other half of the deadly duo signed from Staines Town in the Summer. Both Simon and Declan are products of the Staines Town youth policy. A prolific scorer with his former club and has already made an impact at Loakes Park.

TREVOR HOW Defender: Aged 27. The backbone of the Wycombe defence and this years club captain. Gained Football League experience with Watford, making 91 league appearances. Joined the club from Aylesbury United at the start of last season and was voted Player of the Season.

STEVE LONG Forward: Aged 29. An experienced striker who missed much of last season due to injury problems. In his seventh season with the club and has always scored regularly. Joined from Loughborough College and previously with Burton Albion.



Finding myself at Kings Cross at an early hour last Saturday and discovering the Gateshead game called off, I travelled down to Hampshire and chose an excellent Isthmian clash between Famborough Town and Boreham Wood. I was very impressed with the set-up at Famborough, a nice little stand, good catering, a well-organised Club Shop well stocked with souvenirs, raffles and Pontoon cards to swell club funds, and all in all the impression that it was a progressive club really going places. WEALDSTONE first entered the Trophy in 1972/73, when, after disposing of Waterlooville (1-0), Andover (4-2) and Winchester City (1-0), we fell in the 3rd Qualifying Round to Banbury Utd. by 3-1.

A most depressing statistic is that on only two occasions since have Wealdstone won at least

three Trophy matches in a season.

1973/74 is our most successful season to date, when we defeated Hatfield, Dunstable, Boston, Wimbledon (!) and Hastings Utd. before bowing out to South Shields in the Third Round (not the quarter-finals as many people think).

Who would believe that we then suffered 7 years of qualifying round exits to Finchley, Leatherhead, Barnet (twice), Harrow Borough, Harlow and Oxford City. The latter defeat is

probably Bobby Moores best result as a Manager!

Having reached the 2nd Round proper in 1981/82, somebody else went mad in quoting us as one of the favourites for the Cup. A very strong Dagenham outfit supplemented by some eccentric refereeing put paid to that.

After 1st Round exits in the last two seasons at Wycombe Wanderers and Yeovil respectively, it

is a relief to progress into the 2nd Round.

Gola League sides are poised to take a firm grip on the Trophy once again, and although Telford are probably everyones favourites, it is very rare for a side to be so successful in both the F.A. Cup and the Trophy in the same season and for the same reason I will discount Burton Albion. Dagenham, always a Trophy threat, proved my point by going out in this years first round at Barnet.

Three or four sides from the feeder leagues will present a strong challenge, and many

predictions will he heard.

My last four? Enfield, Altrincham, Bath City and a team beginning with 'W'.

So for once I can't upset anyone today.

New Super Stadium Planned

Club Chairman, David Morritt, announced last week plans for a new £1 million Super Stadium as part of an ambitious project to bring League Soccer to Harrow.

Our present Lower Mead Stadium would be pulled down and the new Multi-purpose Stadium

built on its site

The new Stadium would have a capacity of 10,000 of which 7,000 would be seated. Planning permission for the Stadium will be sought for in the next couple of months from Harrow Council. The new development will include facilities for other sports in addition to the customary football.

The proposed scheme has been the dream of David Morritt since joining Wealdstone some four years ago, and it is hoped that the new Stadium would be finished in time for the start of the 1986/87

season

Whilst building was taking place Wealdstone will have to find a temporary "Home". Negotiations are going on th find a suitable Club willing to accommodate us during this period. Harrow Borough's Earlsmead Ground is one possibility, indeed Borough have been approached to join us in the venture. The Club has played at Lower Mead Stadium since 1923 having moved from College Farm Ground in Belmont Road, Wealdstone.

The new Stadium, when completed, would be named the Morritt Stadium.
