An Apology – And Explanation by Colin Pope

WE would like to extend our very sincere apologies to those people who came to Lower Mead on Tuesday night fully expecting – as arranged – a home game against Brentford in the Morritt Homes Capital League Cup, only to find it had been postponed.

Through no fault of our own we had been placed in a very unfortunate position. It was getting on for 5pm on Monday night when we received a telephone call from Brentford telling us that as they had got a spate of injuries, and had a Canon League fixture later in the week, they felt they could not risk playing. Apparently several of the squad they intended bringing had been ear-marked for possible first team duty, and manager Frank McLintock felt he was unable to possibly further jeopardise his position by playing.

Obviously at little more than 24 hours notice there was little we could do apart from informing the Fleet Street News Agencies, asking them to show the fixture in Tuesday morning's papers as being postponed rather than not give it. Needless to say, this didn't happen so of course we were left powerless to act.

There is nothing worse than turning out for a match which doesn't happen and we can only regret your wasted journey, and ask you to appreciate that there was nothing else we could have done.

As manager Briam Hall says in his column, there is an air of expectancy generally prevalent at us being rewarded with a home tie in the third round of the FA Trophy on February 23rd. Welling United of the Southern Premier will be our opposition and without wanting to tempt providence, it would rank as a major upset if we failed to get through to the quarter finals. Yes, I know Fisher beat Telford at the Buck's Head last Saturday but obviously Stan Storton's lads had their eyes on a richly rewarding (in all senses of the word) FA Cup trip to Everton!

Welling were held 2-2 at home to Merthyr on Saturday but won the replay (watched by Brian

Hall) comfortably 2-0.

A lot of people do seem to think that this is to be Wealdstone's Trophy year, and it would certainly be a magnificent fillip to what I know will be a spendid season, for even if we do not win the Gola League, we are hardly likely to finish too far down. We've not lost too many matches since last August, and a collapse hardly seems likely.

Neighbours Harrow Borough have got a tough one with a visit from Enfield (a repeat of their semi-final year!) but this time I fancy Enfield to come out on top. For my money they are one of the best League sides I've seen this season. And I don't rank Kidderminster too far behind them!

Sad, though, that we shall both be at home, and therefore have a 'split' gate.

Our record against Hillingdon Borough

WEALDSTONE and Hillingdon Borough have met on forty one previous occasions with the 'Stones winning 17, drawing 11 and losing 13. These encounters have produced 117 goals with Wealdstone just ahead, 63 - 54.



GRAHAM COX (Goalkeeper): Signed at the start of the season having been out of football for a while. Previously played in the Football League for Brentford and more recently with fellow Southern Leaguers Addlestone & Weydbridge.

ALAN DAVIES (Defender): Hillingdon's Assistant Manager who normally plays at full back, and has just rejoined the "Leas Stadium" outfit from Wycombe Wanderers. Prior to his previous spell at Hillindon, Alan had played with Q.P.R., Guildford City and Bedford Town.

VINCE DURCAN (Defender): Full back who rejoined the club three seasons ago, having had a short spell with Isthmian League neighbours Harrow Borough. Before his earlier spell at the "Leas" Vince was previously an apprentice with Fulham.



New Super Stadium Planned

Club Chairman, David Morritt, announced last week plans for a new£1 million Super Stadium as part of an ambitious project to bring League Soccer to Harrow.

Our present Lower Mead Stadium would be pulled down and the new Multi-purpose Stadium built on its site.

The new Stadium would have a capacity of 10,000 of which 7,000 would be seated. Planning permission for the Stadium will be sought for in the next couple of months from Harrow Council. The new development will include facilities for other sports in addition to the customary football.

The proposed scheme has been the dream of David Morritt since joining Wealdstone some four years ago, and it is hoped that the new Stadium would be finished in time for the start of the 1986/87 season.

Whilst building was taking place Wealdstone will have to find a temporary "Home". Negotiations are going on th find a suitable Club willing to accommodate us during this period. Harrow Borough's Earlsmead Ground is one possibility, indeed Borough have been approached to join us in the venture. The Club has played at Lower Mead Stadium since 1923 having moved from College Farm Ground in Belmont Road, Wealdstone.

The new Stadium, when completed, would be named the Morritt Stadium.
