The Long, Long Road Gets Shorter ...! by Colin Pope

SATURDAY, March 16th, 1985 will go down as one of the milestones in this Club's long illustrious history. At 4.45 pm on that grey day, with snow swirling from a leaden sky, a lot of the pain and frustration that we have endured over the past decade or so, suddenly seemed a whole lot more bearable, as referee Alan Seville, from Birmingham, signalled the end of the match, and we were through to the semi-finals of the FA Trophy. Frickley Athletic, that tough, uncompromising side from the Yorkshire coal belt, had been snuffed out 3-1 after Wealdstone had turned in a superb performance.

It was a match not many of our Supporters relished. And I am quite certain that manager Brian Hall, in the privacy of his own thoughts, must have felt that we had a mountain to climb, having regard to Frickley's superb run in recent weeks which had made them, like us, contenders for the double.

Personally I felt I had not seen a Wealdstone side quite so motivated as we were on Saturday for many a long day. Commitment was there in abundance, and obviously the lads now have the 'smell' and 'feel' of Wembley in their blood!

Looking back, I suppose Frickley were killed off with that stunning 30 seconds opening goal, so spectacularly taken by our new striking sensation Andy Graham, after such superb work by Alan Cordice, who went on to crown a tremendous performance with two great goals of his own. These two bled the heart out of Frickley, while our defence can rarely have played a tighter game. I think a special word of appreciation is justified to goalkeeper Bob Iles. Bob's hand injury had, in fact, ruled him out of the match, but his newly signed deputy Paul Cotter was ineligible, so Bob had to grit his teeth and play despite being in severe pain every time he touched the ball. Bob made quite a few great saves, and perhaps epitomised the spirit of the team.

But now for a carp! How sad that such a spendid game should be watched by a crowd of just under 1,000! Wealdstone's meagre gate, in the cold light of day in the Sunday papers, looked quite forlom matched against the big crowds of the other three quarter-final games. And for once we didn't even have Watford to blame! When one realises that Frickley Athletic brought three coaches of supporters, then we really had no more than our normal quota of 800 or so. Honest to God, here's Wealdstone, poised to win the finest football competition outside the Football League; within two matches of a Wembley Stadium appearance, and we cannot get a thousand people! TRAGIC . . .

Is there an answer? I won't harp on the fact that our visitors tonight, Yeovil, already earmarked for relegation barring a miracle, attracted 1,300 on Saturday when even entertaining the BOTTOM club!! Harrow people must have lost all sense of proportion!

The match was marred of course, by the very painful injury to our skipper Paul Bowgett, whose right eye was totally and completely closed, with severe bruising all around, as the result of being quite brutally elbowed. When I saw Paul soon after the match he looked a sorry sight — more reminiscent of a heavyweight boxing match than a football game. But hard cookies like Paul do not crumble, so I do not suppose he will be out of action too lond!

The FA Trophy Competition did not begin their meeting at Lancaster Gate until 1 pm yesterday, and so the semi-final draw was not expected until mid-afternoon. As this programme had to go to press at 10 a.m. I am unable to comment on it. But the full draw WILL be found in this issue.





STEVE SMITH: Keeper. Signed for Yeovil in August 1984 after a spell as Player/Manager for Trowbridge Town. A fearless keeper who has had League experience with Crewe, Bradford City & Birmingham.

DAVID LINNEY: Signed from Oxford United at start of season 83/84. One of the most accomplished full backs in the Gola League and was voted the Player of the Year last season. Started his career with Birmingham City signed for Yeovil in competition from many other clubs. Team Captain.

RICHIE HORTON: Another local player who is enjoying a testimonial year, his attitude is tremendous whether he is in the first or second team. A great club player who plays at full back or midfield.

PAUL THORPE: Has played for Newport, Bristol City and Torquay. Signed for Yeovil in September 1984. Strong, powerful central defender who also scores his fair share of goals from set pieces. Only twenty years old and could we'll return to the Football League before long.

COLIN BARNES: Signed from Torquay United in October 84 for a fee of £3,000 and initially went a long way to repaying this fee by scoring six goals in his first seven games with the Club. Made his name as a prolific goal scorer with Barnet.

PAUL CHEESLEY: Started his playing career at Norwich City and after being spotted playing in Bristol by Ron Saunders local scout, returned to Bristol City to play and helping them to promotion to the First Division. Had an injury in his second season First Div. which finished his League career. Snapped up by Gerry Gow early this season.

JEREMY BROWN: A fast and tricky left winger who on his day is one of the most exciting players in the Gola League. Now in his fifth season with the Club having been signed from Newport Co. also had a loan spell with Birmingham.






Kettering-Northampton Merger?
