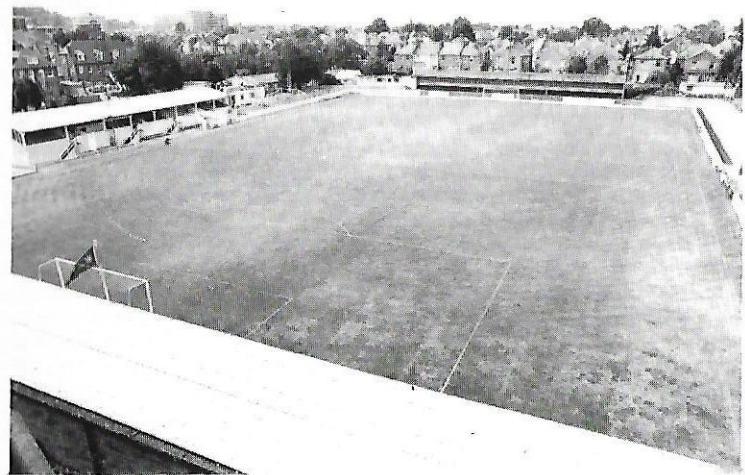
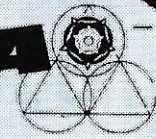

ON THE BALL with Brian Hall

I think the saying goes "after the Lord Mayors Show" This was certainly the case for us on Tuesday with the third such encounter this season in games which in my opinion we have totally dominated in the first half, failed to score, become frustrated, and then lacked concentration at that vital moment. Those games were Boston, Bath, and now Yeovil. It naturally upsets our dreams but not necessarily our plans. It seems ironical also this week that other successful F.A. Trophy Quarter Finalists, Enfield lost at home to Dartford, Boston lost at home to Telford, but Altrincham won at Ketteringham in the Bob Lord Trophy, and quite frankly are an extremely well organised and impressive side therefore, the championship possibilities are still intact! We must ensure that we take points and chances, because no-one gives much away in this league. It merely shows that football nor life is consistent.

It would once again appear that the rules concerning our national game are not consistent either, even by the persons allegedly controlling the game in the Canon League, which is after all the national league, and one would expect a reasonable level of consistency at that standard. I saw two players cautioned last week by a League referee for alleged time wasting, he took longer to caution them and to demonstrate to the crowd what he was doing and to inform them that he was in charge, than the actual time wasting offence. I assume that he added on time at the end of the game for the offences, but I wonder if he added on time for his own exhibition. It seems to me that he could have merely added on time if he felt that time was being wasted, which if he states "in his opinion" it was, then I regret to say that in my opinion it was not.

The inconsistency? On Sunday I saw on TV the Liverpool v. Spurs game, and with my own eyes saw that when Spurs were leading 1 nil they conceded a corner. I saw Ray Clemence retrieve the ball, go back to his own goal line still clutching the ball, and when satisfied that Spurs were organised weakly throw the ball away in order that the corner could be taken. It is apparently accepted now as an every match occurrence even in European competition. I would respectfully suggest that whilst everyone with a love and passion for our game is attempting to apply a cooling down of behaviour on the terraces and on the field of play, that possibly those people in authority also demonstrate composure rather than antagonise spectators or players, or at least be consistent. Time wasting considered clinically can be interpreted in many ways, and can be adopted even when the ball is "live", it is a subject on which I would like to hear the views of supporters, players and referees alike, and I am sure a friendly discussion or debate would go on for hours.

I am sorry that I have used most of my allotted space to express what one may think as insignificant incidents, but sometimes areas of the game bug me. I love this game dearly, and all the competition and problems that go with it. It is a super game and I honestly feel that we must start putting it right before we ruin it - that means all of us.

DISASTER STRIKES, BUT DARTFORD THROW A LIFE-LINE!

YOU just wouldn't credit it, would you?? In the event, and completely unexpected, Ian turned up on Tuesday and then informed Yeovil that he would turn out for them against Frickley today before flying out to the West Indies early tomorrow morning! Such is Ian's enthusiasm for soccer!

STOP PRESS!!!

We shall be playing our first ever competitive game on a Sunday next week, March 31st, when we will be entertaining Scarborough, kick-off 11 am. Scarborough the previous day visit Enfield, and have booked overnight accommodation in Harrow so as to play us, and therefore get at least one overdue fixture out of the way. Be interesting to see if Sunday soccer proves popular!

Almost to a man (and woman!) our Supporters seem to curse the fact that we have drawn Enfield in the FA Trophy semi-finals on Saturday 6 April. They see it as some consolation, though, that at least we shall be at home for the second leg on Saturday 13th, and will know precisely what we have to do to reach Wembley. I (like a lot of the others apparently) rate Enfield the best side I have seen in the Gola League and if we survive, then I am quite certain Paul Bowgett will be handed the Trophy at Wembley against either Altrincham or Boston Utd. Then come the visits of Runcom and Scarborough – thus counting today we shall have five games in eight days. The sort of programme which would have the Canon League boys shouting 'foul'!!

It's always a special delight to welcome the Directors, Players and Supporters of Weymouth, for we seem to enjoy a rather special relationship with the Dorset outfit. They have picked up after an indifferent start and of late have had a few good results. They'll obviously wish to erase the memory of our 3-0 win down there on 1st December.

WELL, at long last, we've made it to the F.A. Trophy Semi-Finals! What a marvellous game against Frickley last Saturday, and what nice and friendly people. In our own VP bar, we were packed out but there was no animosity, in fact all the Frickley contingent, including the players were real gentlemen and took the result manfully, which is really something out of the ordinary these days, and we look forward to greeting them again when they return for a league match later on this season.

Although Enfield is not too far away, we intend running a Vice Presidents coach for the semi-final on the 6th April. We feel that at least, if we do, there will be no parking problems there, and hopefully, we can all be together, celebrating on the return journey (the coach will have a bar).

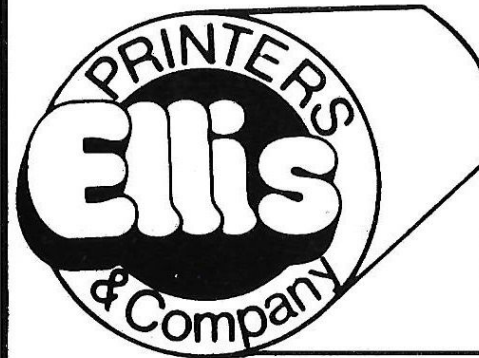

Played over 500 league games during a long career that included spells at Aston Villa, Everton, Bristol Rovers and Preston North End. Played 3 games for Wales during which time he scored 2 goals. 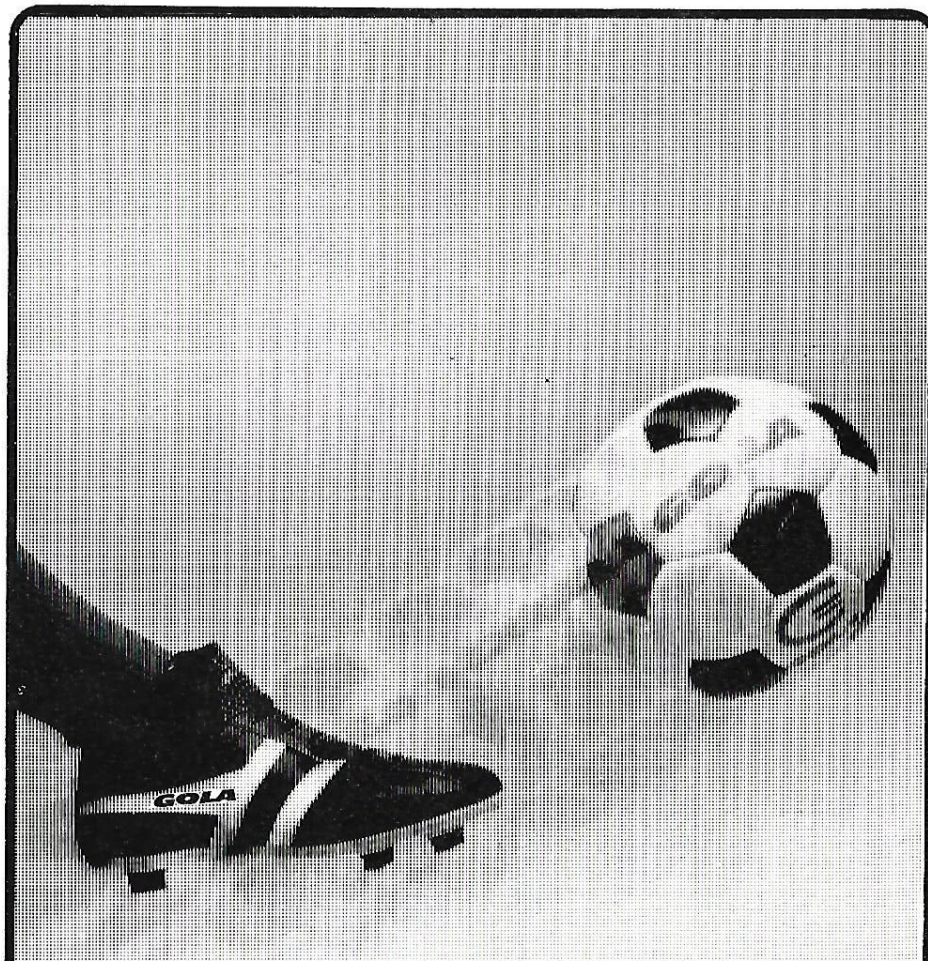

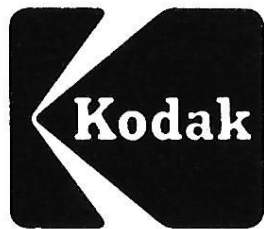
