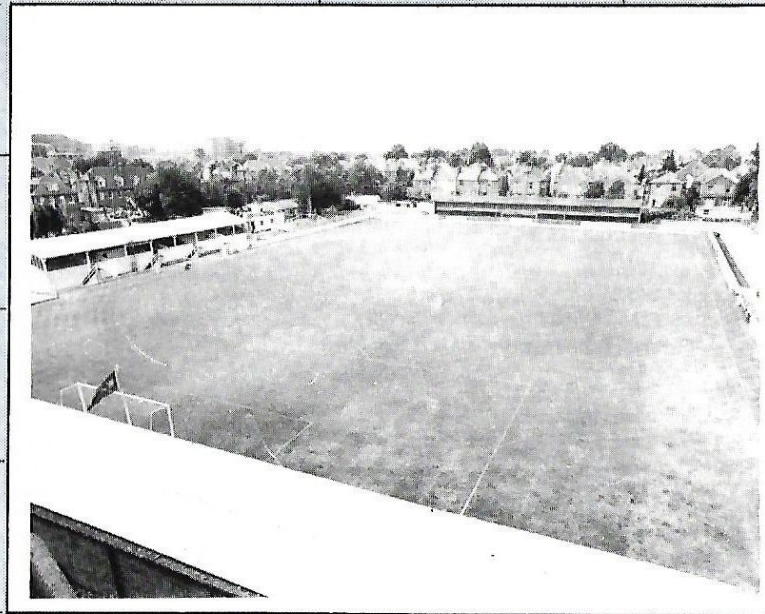

## Introducing Runcorn . . . .

**RAY McBRIDE:** Signed last season, this Wirral-based goalkeeper has experience in the West Cheshire League having played with Vauxhall, Port Sunlight and Stork.

**BRIAN KETTLE:** Schooled at Liverpool F.C. where he was skipper of the highly successful Reserve side, Brian went on to join Wigan Athletic before being forced to quit top flight soccer through injury. He has bounced back to play consistently well for the Linnets. Brian's efforts were obviously recognised by his team mates who have chosen him as their 'Player of the Year' for the past two seasons.

**MICK ROBERTS:** A former winner of a non-league soccer yearbook 'Personality of the Season' award, Mick is a highly respected figure at Canal Street. Has represented the Football Association. He was signed from Winsford United.

**STUART PARKER:** League experience with Blackpool and Bury. Signed after short spell with Witton Albion. Happy playing either as striker or centre of defence.

**BOBBY FRASER:** Liverpool based Bobby Fraser is a much redoubted opponent be it as a threat to defenders or foil to strikers. He played at Liverpool and Tranmere as a youngster before moving into the Welsh Leagues and Winsford United. His aerial power has gained him much recognition and he won representative honours in the Cheshire League.

**OSSIE SMITH:** Club Captain. Capped by England for the semi-professional International v. Wales. Scorer of the England goal. A consistent and very popular player who is a frequent goal scorer.

**JOHN IMRIE:** John joined originally as a striker having set a prolific scoring rate at Northern Premier League club, Buxton, who received £1,000 for his services. Now this Greater Manchester based player is more accustomed to playing on the right side of midfield. This 22 year old has also played for Bury.

**ALAN CROMPTON:** Alan's crouched, darting style of play makes him an exciting player to watch, and he has proved a foe of many defences with his trickery and spectacular shooting. A resident of Rugby League stronghold Leigh, Alan was picked up by Sunderland as a 16 year old before making 60 Central League appearances for Blackburn Rovers. He joined Runcorn from Wigan Athletic and has been an integral part of the Canal Street success story.

**MARK CARTER:** Signed in the close season, this highly rated striker previously played with South Liverpool and Bangor City, where he was renowned as a goal scorer. Featured in Bangor City's F.A. Trophy Final side 1983/84 season.

**ANDY BROCKBANK:** Now enjoying his second period with the club after recently returning from playing with Canberra in the Australian League. Previously had experience with Blackpool. Left sided mid field player.

**GRAHAM JONES:** A close season signing from Stockport County, has a wealth of football league experience having made 255 appearances for Luton Town, Torquay and Stockport County.

**RAY WOODS:** A product of Tranmere Rovers having graduated through the youth team. Skilful attacking player.

**PAUL McCRAE:** Promising young striker having played for Rochdale youth team.

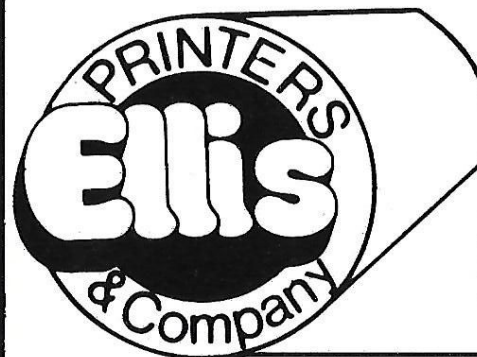

## Introducing Scarborough . . . .

**GRAEME CRAWFORD (Goal):** Signed from Rochdale in the summer of 1983 after making 430 Football League appearances for Sheffield United, York City, Scunthorpe and Rochdale.

**JOHN HANNAH (Forward):** Boro' signed him on his return from Malta. Had experience with Darlington before going to Malta.

**NEIL THOMPSON (Defender):** Joined the Boro in the summer of 1983 from Hull City for whom he made 31 appearances. Made 36 Alliance appearances last season.

**KENNY DENNIS (Defender):** A local full back who has been a regular member of the side for the past four seasons. Player of the Year in 1983.

**NEIL SELLERS (Midfield):** Signed from Goole Town in 1979 for a £5,000 fee. Was voted Player of the Year in 1980 and 1981 and is the only player to have won the award in successive seasons. For the past three seasons he has been a regular member of the England semi-professional team.

**TRENTON WIGGAN (Forward):** A former England schoolboy international whose transfer from Gainsborough Trinity in 1983 cost Boro £2,500. He began his career with Sheffield United for whom he made 24 first team appearances.

**PAT OLNEY (Forward):** Was a junior at Old Trafford and had a spell with Preston before moving to Bangor, from whom Boro signed him for £3,500 in 1980. Missed most of last season through injury and was restricted to seven Alliance appearances.

**DAVID BOWMAN (Forward):** A local youngster and the son of the Boro trainer, he has made 63 Alliance appearances over the past five seasons.

**MARSHALL BURKE (Midfield):** Signed in August 1984. Formerly with Burnley, Leeds United, Blackburn Rovers and Lincoln City.

**PETER SUTCLIFFE (Midfield):** Released by Bangor City at the end of season 1983/84. Previously with Manchester United, Port Vale and Chester.

**HARRY DUNN (Player/Manager):** Recently re-joined his local club from Frickley Athletic on his appointment as Player/Manager. In his first spell with Boro' he made 858 league and cup appearances including four F.A. Challenge Trophy finals at Wembley, two of which he captained. On his release from Boro at the end of season 1982/83 he joined Frickley Athletic with whom he has been an ever present member of the first team up to his return to Boro'.

**NIGEL ROSE (Forward):** Commenced his career with Boro' as a teenager. Was released at the end of season 1982/83 when he joined Frickley Athletic. Returned to his native team on the appointment of the present Player/Manager.

**GRAHAM HARTLEY (Defender):** Another product of local football who enjoys playing for his local club. Played regularly up to the end of season 1983/84. Recently rejoined Boro' after a short spell in local League football.

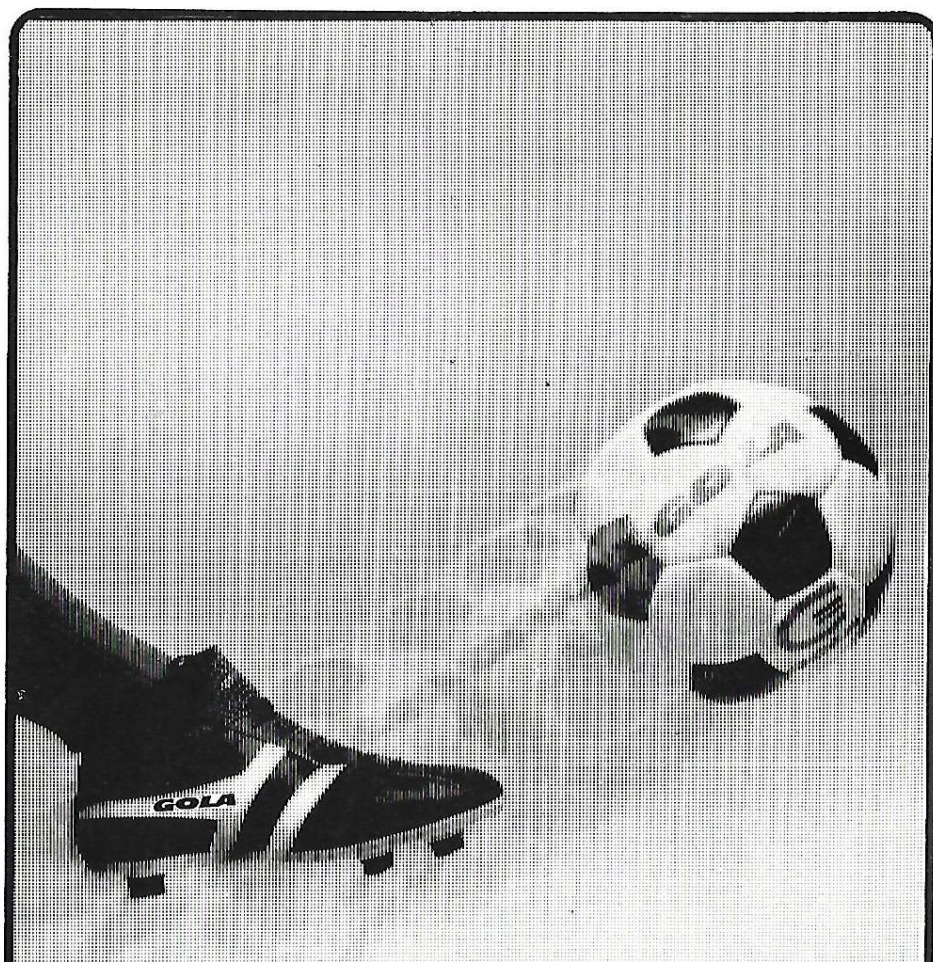

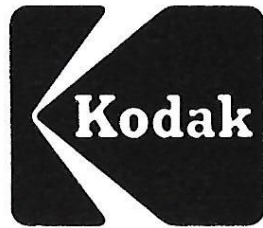
