

WEMBLEY-BOUND AFTER 19 YEARS!

WEALDSTONE at Wembley! Doesn't it leave a very satisfying feeling as those words roll off the tonque?

Heartiest congratulations to skipper Paul Bowgett and the lads, and how richly they deserve this ultimate accolade in a footballers' life of playing on the hallowed Wembley turf. And what a cliffhanger Saturday's second semi-final turned out to be, and Lower Mead was no place for faint hearts from 4.30 pm onwards as Enfield threw everything at us in a vain attempt to force a second goal and take the game into extra time.

Frankly, we cannot complain on the day that Enfield won 1-0 and Eddie McCluskey's boys proved what we always knew - that they are a top-class side. Thank goodness that we had got our two goals the previous week which proved a sufficiently thick cushion in the final analysis.

As a match it was no great spectacle, and was never going to be for obvious reasons. But how superbly well we defended, and our character came through as Enfield got the early goal they so desperately needed but we refused to panic, and justifiably reached the FA Trophy final for the

It might be an opportune time for us all to spare a thought for the players who didn't make the team in either semi-final match, for competition for places is now razor-sharp. The whole squad have done us proud so far this season and it is a huge disappointment to those who have been ever present or thereabouts only to find themselves on the sidelines at the climax. I know as pro footballers they need to take the disappointments in their stride, but even so, I feel it is nice now if we remember how splendidly they have served us. Sentimental, perhaps, but then, I reckon sentiment is no bad thing now and again . . .

Thanks - and I know I now speak for chairman David Morritt and his Directors - for the magnificent attendance on Saturday. Mind you, gates like that only serve to make us greedy, and

daydream how nice it would be to have a crowd like that every home game!

You will all have noticed with great delight that Bath City, perhaps our strongest rivals for the Gola League championship again lost on Saturday and it really does bring the incredible double well within our compass. Mind you, as manager Brian Hall said to me in the early hours of Sunday morning (if we DO do the double) 'How the hell do you follow that next season?'. As someone put it rather neatly - 'by adding the Middlesex Senior Cup to make it three!!'

And so we proudly return to Wembley Stadium 19 years after we were last there, when

Wealdstone beat Hendon in the FA Amatuer Cup before more than 50,000 people.

However, Brian and his squad have got a lot of work to do before then, and a very heavy week again, for apart from tonight's match, we receive Enfield again on Thursday and then visit Nuneaton on Saturday. Nuneaton are a very good side indeed and a share of the points is all we can reasonably expect. But if we travel there on Saturday having gained four points this week, it

Sutton United NOT moving up

GOOD EVENING everyone and a special welcome to our friends from Northwich and in particular to my opposite number Frank Burgess who has always been so helpful in the past. We of course will be hoping to relieve them of the F.A. Trophy shortly, but for now two points will suffice in our quest for the Gola League title. A warm welcome too to Vics' keeper Dave Ryan who was good enough to come and cheer us on (?) at Altrincham and, I believe, at Runcom as well – I hope the former game at least showed him what to expect!

The new edition (No. 16) of "Pyramid Magazine" arrived on Saturday and there should be copies left tonight on sale. It was interesting to read that in spite of popular belief Isthmian leaders Sutton United are NOT likely to take up Gola League status next season. Some £20,000 costs ar anticipated with the take-up of a new lease and taking over running costs of the ground from the local council next year, and Sutton have therefore decided to reorganise their finances before committing themselves to the climb in status. Worthing, on the other hand, are ambitious and would apparently jump at the prospect of Gola League progress, although they admit the need for ground improvements (terracing behind one goal and a new boardroom in particular) before being able to celebrate their Centenary by climbing to join the Non-League elite.

Witton Albion of the Northern Premier League have already put in their application for Gola League membership, although they have quite a battle on their hands to clinch their title with Stafford Rangers narrow favourites and Macclesfield Town and Burton Albion also in contention. Cheltenham lead a similarly frantic rush for the Southern League title and the chance to grab almost certainly Yeovil's place in the Gola League.

Lastly, may I give programme enthusiasts advance notice of the 4th Annual Barnet Football Programme Fair which will be held on Sunday 21st April in the Social Club at Underhill. Admission will be 25p on the door and the Fair will run from 11.00 am until 2.30 pm with 7 dealers offering a wide range of programmes from pre-war to current season.

DAVE RYAN (Goalkeeper): Has missed just one league game in the Alliance in five seasons. This is Dave's eighth season at the Drill Field after signing from Southport. Recruited by Manchester United straight from school, his progress was hampered by injury. His popularity at the Drill Field guaranteed him a record testimonial in 1981/82. Has made 312 appearances out of the last 316 games, 67 appearances last season.

MARK DEAN (Utility): Joined the Club from Chester just before the start of last season. 19 year old Mark quickly established himself in the side, has the ability to play in a number of positions and certainly has a bright future in the game. 58 appearances last season/2 goals.

TONY MURPHY (Midfield/Left Back): Enjoyed Vics two Embley visits as much as anyone after losing in three previous semi-finals. Signed by Stan Storton, Tony also had spells at Runcom and Bangor City with Stan. He is a strong tackler who likes to join the attack. 24 appearances last

KEN JONES (Central Defender): Ken clocked up his 900th appearance for Vics at Wembley and is now in his sixteenth season at the Club, deservedly receiving a third testimonial last term. Signed from Ellesmere Port Town after starting his career with West Bromwich Albion. Ken has been voted Vics "Player of the Year" on four occasions and is the Club Captain, 66 appearances

GRAHAM ABEL (Midfield): Although generally found in midfield, Graham can also operate in defence or attack. Signed from near neighbours Runcom, where he played in their Northern Premier League side. After a spell in the Reserves he has claimed a regular first team spot. 52 appearances last season/9 goals.

EDDIE BISHOP (Midfield): Another local player spotted by manager Murphy playing Sunday League football. A tenacious tackler, who impressed immediately on his debut.

GLYN STEVENS (Midfield): A talented 6 foot midfield player, who is manager Murphy's first signing, joining Vics from Northern Premier League side Horwich R.M.I., where he has been attracting the attention of several clubs.

STEVE CRAVEN (Midfield or Attack): Arrived back at the Drill Field in the close season after leaving for spells at Altrincham and Bangor during 1983/84. Joined the Club originally from Crewe Alex after playing for John King at Transere. 27 appearances last term/3 goals.

PAUL REID (Striker): A local lad, Paul's scoring exploits for Nantwich Town made him the Cheshire League's top scorer and prompted his move to Vics. Top scorere last term with 28 goals. 62 appearances last season.

RAY REDSHAW (Striker): A 25 year old player signed literally hours prior to Vic's visit to Nuneaton. Terry Murphy beat off strong opposition from Altrincham to obtain his signature. Began his career with Glossop before a two year spell at Horwich where his prolific scoring record led to a move into the Football League with Wigan Athletic, from whom he joined Vics.

DAVIE YOUNG (Utility): Joined Vics during the close season. His career began at Tranmere when Vics ex boss John King was manager. Has also had spells with Wigan and Wrexham. Aged 21 he is a full time student at Chester College. Davie is equally at home in midfield or in the back

DAVE ESSER (Striker): A 27 year old former England Schoolboys trialist, has played for Everton and Rochdale, for whom he was sent off on his debut, before moving abroad for spells with Apoel in Cyprus, and Karlstruna of Sweden. He then returned to join Gola League rivals Altrincham, before moving to Hyde and then to Witton Albion of the N.P.L. His goal scoring exploits attracted the attention of Vics boss Terry Murphy, who signed him in January of this year. Opened his account for Vics with a last minute winner at Altrincham.

RORY BLEASE: Very fast winger who had earlier played for Runcom, prior to joining Chester for whom he made several first team appearances. Signed one hour prior to the registration deadline.
