BECAUSE of the weekend interfering with our normal printing process, this article is being written in the early hours of Friday morning, soon after we had had the mortification of seeing Enfield again beat us!

Before their visit to Maidstone the Cheshire side had, in fact, got a better goal difference than we had, but a hasty bout of mental arithmetic in the middle of the night, as I write these notes, suggests that we now have the edge!

A lot was at stake on Saturday, of course, at Nuneaton and if we did get something from Manor Park it will have taken some of the sting out of dropping three home points out of the last four.

The Football Association's Adrian Titcomb told me on Thursday that there was tremendous interest in Boston following their Trophy victory over Altrincham. Their semi-final drew a gate well in excess of 4,000 and it seems ':.ely that as many as three times that number will make the long trek to Wembley.

Sad to relate, after watching the lads at Nuneaton, I shall not now be seeing them again until May 4th at Kettering, being away. Hopefully, by then we shall be back on course for the title!

# SFC Wealdstone did us proud . . .

DUE to the welter of excitement this past 10 days or so, I feel not nearly enough attention has been focused on the recent Morritt Homes Capital League match when we went down so narrowly to Dagerham, 3-2

I intend to set the matter right now, for I don't suppose many people are acquainted with the full facts. Wealdstone, for that match fielded six players from SFC Wealdstone FC, the Supporters team, plus Paul Cotter in goal, Lee Holmes, Hughie Dow and two trialists. 



# FRANK HARBUD RECOVERING


