



Although there are sure to be numerous other reminders in today's programme, I must reiterate how important it is to the club's finances that all supporters buy their tickets for Wembley in advance from the Club Office and not at the stadium turnstiles on the day of the match. The new issue (no.17) of "Pyramid Magazine" will hopefully be received in time for today's game, although the news concerning "Non-League Digest" is less encouraging. Mounting production problems and a grave cash flow situation are threatening the future of this excellent publication and of course postal problems in the area of origin have aggravated the position as regards the settlement of bills from clubs around the country as well as distribution of the last issue. Rumours are that the magazine has already folded, but I am told that there is still a chance of survival although the overdue issue is unlikely to be received by today. A few extra copies of the April edition of "West Middlesex Review" have been obtained for those who missed them earlier in the month, so please call in at the Club Shop today if you were unlucky previously.

Our glut of Wembley souvenirs should start to arrive today and are mentioned elsewhere in the programme. As the town of Boston is likely to be emptied on May 11th, Wealdstone supporters should make every effort to be suitably adorned in blue and yellow to let the team know that we are there in force. We have never had any problem outsinging Non-League rivals so let's make it a visual spectacle to remember too!

As the season nears an end, supporters may wish to put their programme collection in order, so please remember that the official Wealdstone F.C. binders are still in stock at £1.30 (or four for £5.00). As end of season "sale bargains" we also have some past editions of the Rothmans Non-League Annuals which are now reduced from £4.95 to just £1.99 each whilst stocks last, as well as some more of our popular Wealdstone programme bundles (50 assorted homes for just 25p).

On the subject of programmes, advance notice is given for the 11th International Programme Fair which will take place on Saturday 1st June at the Connaught Rooms, Great Queen Street, W.C.2. The Fair will be open from 11 am to 4 pm and is the annual highlight for collectors with thousands of programmes on offer from the country's top dealers. Admission is 60p on the day itself or only 30p with a SAE in advance from me in the club shop today or on Wednesday.

For lapel badge collectors we have additions to our stocks from Bedworth Town and Uxbridge. I would also like to send good wishes to a regular badge "customer", Colin Downey, who has the privilege this afternoon of refereeing the F.A. Vase Final at Wembley. Having seen Colin perform on the T.V., he is clearly one of our best referees and would be welcome in charge of any of our games. Had he been officiating on Monday, I doubt whether we would have seen such ridiculous bookings for Messrs. Bowgett and Greenaway which at this stage of the season can easily lead to suspensions and have such a disruptive effect on the destination of trophies.

Lastly, I hope to see many regulars at Lower Mead take the opportunity to come and see the two remaining Fulham Rugby League fixtures tomorrow and next Friday, May 3rd. The Club Shop will be open on both occasions to give supporters an extra chance to stock up on Wembley scarves, hats, flags, etc. As I try to take more notice of Rugby in general in the press to avoid asking too many stupid questions, I wonder if anyone else saw the following report in the Daily Mail recently ... 
