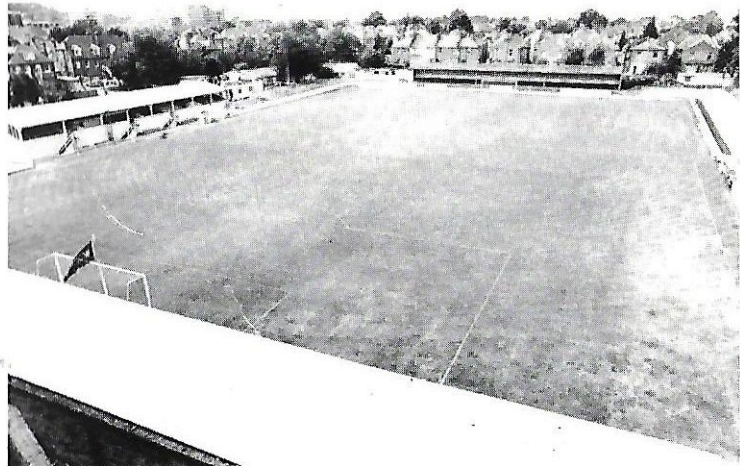
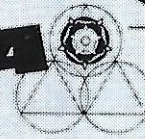

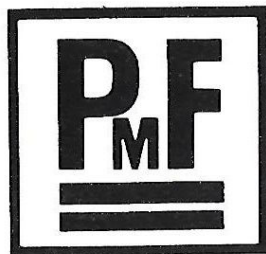

It was great news to me to hear that Graham Carr from Nunecton was appointed manager at Northampton recently. Life has not been perfect and football is unpredictable, but at the end we still come shining through. So to those people, and you know who you are, thanks for just being around.

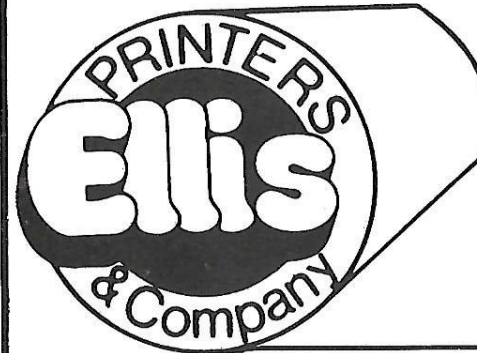

PAUL MAXTED: New signing from nearby Pontefract Colliery where he was regular goalkeeper in last seasons promotion winning team in the N.E. Counties League. Recently played in Bamsley Reserves.

SEAN MARSHALL: Player Manager. Took over as Manager late last season. This is Sean's first ever position as a manager. A player of vast non-league experience. CLUB SHOP NEWS

GOOD EVENING everyone and welcome to this our last home match of the 1984/85 season. These notes are written before the result of Sunday's Bath v. Enfield game is known, but if Enfield won and we managed to obtain three points at Kidderminster on Monday night, then we could be in a position to clinch the title tonight! However, bearing in mind Enfield's League form of late, not to mention our own, I imagine the destination of the Championship trophy will not be decided until our visits to Kettering and Barnet have been made. According to our good friend Mr. McCluskey of Enfield the title will not be coming here, but I don't really think we need put too much importance on the comments of one whose own team is performing with even greater inconsistency! It does seem strange that the title seems destined to go to the team that plays least badly at present rather than to a side that performs with the confidence and ability normally attributed to League champions. There seems to be no side on a convincing "title challenge run" and one wonders if the incentive for taking the title is great enough. In every other League of any consequence there is either promotion or a European place to play for, yet all we have is the financial reward from generous sponsors and a one-in-a-million stab at the Football League which not everyone wants anyway!

In the Club Shop tonight there are still a few copies of an excellent new booklet entitled "A Guide to Non-League Football". These have been produced by Sutton United and give precise ground locations for all the clubs in the Gola, Isthmian, Southern and Northern Premier Leagues, as well as local radio frequencies and recommended pubs. The booklet is very good value at £1.50 and resolves the problems of finding some grounds based on a "three minutes from the town centre" guide.

Only half our consignment of "Pyramid" magazines arrived on Saturday, so hopefully the remainder will be available for tonight's game. There are still a few copies of April's "West Middlesex Review" available and also Rothmans Non-League annuals reduced by £3.00 each to clear. It does not look as if "Non-League Digest" will appear again this season if at all in the future. It will be a great shame if this commendable effort suffers the same fate as "Netstretcher" and "Around Football", but perhaps a Non-League magazine needs an economist as its editor (like "Pyramid") to find any kind of financial viability.

Also in stock tonight are a small number of Wealdstone FC key cases, a new souvenir that we shall have along with key fobs in greater quantities for the start of next season. These sell at 90p and are real leather with the Wealdstone club crest in four colours on the outside.


